

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof as  
6 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated from the  
7 General Assembly Operations Revolving Fund to the President  
8 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives  
9 to meet ordinary and contingent expenses. Of this amount,  
10 50% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for such  
11 expenditures and 50% is appropriated to the Speaker of the  
12 House for such expenditures.

13 ARTICLE 2

14 Section 5. The sum of \$22,339,103, or so much of that  
15 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Auditor  
16 General from the Audit Expense Fund for audits, studies, and  
17 investigations.

18 ARTICLE 3

1 Section 5. The following amount, or so much of that  
 2 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General  
 3 Assembly Computer Equipment Revolving Fund to the Legislative  
 4 Information System:

5 For Purchase, Maintenance, and Rental of  
 6 General Assembly Electronic Data Processing  
 7 Equipment and for other operational  
 8 purposes of the General Assembly .....1,600,000

9 ARTICLE 4

10 Section 5. The sum of \$14,968,300, or so much thereof as  
 11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Mandatory  
 12 Arbitration Fund to the Supreme Court for Mandatory  
 13 Arbitration Programs.

14 Section 10. The sum of \$131,500, or so much thereof as  
 15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Foreign Language  
 16 Interpreter Fund to the Supreme Court for the Foreign  
 17 Language Interpreter Program.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$851,700, or so much thereof as  
 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Lawyers'  
 20 Assistance Program Fund to the Supreme Court for lawyers'  
 21 assistance programs.

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ARTICLE 5

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Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Supreme Court Historic Preservation Fund to the Supreme Court Historic Preservation Commission for historic preservation purposes.

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ARTICLE 6

7

Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much of those amounts as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes named, are appropriated to the Office of the State Appellate Defender for expenses related to federally assisted programs to work on systemic sentencing issues appeals cases to which the agency is appointed.
