SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/24-2

from Ch. 122, par. 24-2

Amends the School Code. Authorizes a school board (or other eligible entity) to hold school or schedule teachers' institutes, parent-teacher conferences, or staff development on certain school holidays if (1) the person or persons honored by the holiday are recognized through instructional activities conducted on that day or, if the day is not used for student attendance, on the first school day preceding or following that day; and (2) the school board or other entity first holds a public hearing about the proposal. Makes other changes. Effective July 1, 2009.

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
24-2 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/24-2) (from Ch. 122, par. 24-2)

7 Sec. 24-2. Holidays.

(a) Teachers shall not be required to teach on Saturdays $_{L}$ + 8 9 nor, except as provided in subsection (b) of this Section, other school employees, other 10 shall teachers or than 11 noncertificated school employees whose presence is necessary because of an emergency or for the continued operation and 12 maintenance of school facilities or property, be required to 13 14 work on legal school holidays, which are January 1, New Year's Day; the third Monday in January, the Birthday of Dr. Martin 15 16 Luther King, Jr.; February 12, the Birthday of President 17 Abraham Lincoln; the first Monday in March (to be known as Casimir Pulaski's birthday); Good Friday; the day designated as 18 19 Memorial Day by federal law; July 4, Independence Day; the 20 first Monday in September, Labor Day; the second Monday in 21 October, Columbus Day; November 11, Veterans' Veteran's Day; the Thursday in November commonly called Thanksgiving Day; and 22 December 25, Christmas Day. School boards may grant special 23

holidays whenever in their judgment such action is advisable.
 No deduction shall be made from the time or compensation of a
 school employee on account of any legal or special holiday.

(b) A school board or other entity eligible to apply for 4 5 waivers and modifications under Section 2-3.25q of this Code is authorized to hold school or schedule teachers' institutes, 6 7 parent-teacher conferences, or staff development on the third 8 Monday in January (the Birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, 9 Jr.); February 12 (the Birthday of President Abraham Lincoln); the first Monday in March (known as Casimir Pulaski's 10 11 birthday); the second Monday in October (Columbus Day); and 12 November 11 (Veterans' Day), provided that:

13 (1) the person or persons honored by the holiday are 14 recognized through instructional activities conducted on 15 that day or, if the day is not used for student attendance, 16 on the first school day preceding or following that day; 17 and

18 (2) the entity that chooses to exercise this authority 19 first holds a public hearing about the proposal. The entity 20 shall provide notice preceding the public hearing to both 21 educators and parents. The notice shall set forth the time, 22 date, and place of the hearing, describe the proposal, and 23 indicate that the entity will take testimony from educators 24 and parents about the proposal.

25 <u>(c)</u> Commemorative holidays, which recognize specified 26 patriotic, civic, cultural or historical persons, activities,

or events, are regular school days. Commemorative holidays are: 1 2 January 28 (to be known as Christa McAuliffe Day and observed as a commemoration of space exploration), February 15 (the 3 birthday of Susan B. Anthony), March 29 (Viet Nam War Veterans' 4 5 **Veterans** Dav), September 11 (September 11th Dav of 6 Remembrance), the school day immediately preceding Veterans' Veteran's Day (Korean War Veterans' Veterans Day), October 1 7 (Recycling Day), December 7 (Pearl Harbor Veterans' Veterans 8 9 Day) and any day so appointed by the President or Governor. 10 School boards may establish commemorative holidays whenever in 11 their judgment such action is advisable. School boards shall 12 include instruction relative to commemorated persons, activities, or events on the commemorative holiday or at any 13 14 other time during the school year and at any point in the 15 curriculum when such instruction may be deemed appropriate. The 16 State Board of Education shall prepare and make available to 17 school boards instructional materials relative to commemorated persons, activities, or events which may be used by school 18 19 boards in conjunction with any instruction provided pursuant to 20 this paragraph.

21 (d) City of Chicago School District 299 shall observe March 22 4 of each year as a commemorative holiday. This holiday shall 23 be known as Mayors' Day which shall be a day to commemorate and 24 be reminded of the past Chief Executive Officers of the City of 25 Chicago, and in particular the late Mayor Richard J. Daley and 26 the late Mayor Harold Washington. If March 4 falls on a
