2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 3323 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
5	changing Section 3-616 as follows:
6	(625 ILCS 5/3-616) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-616)
7	Sec. 3-616. Disability license plates.
8	(a) Upon receiving an application for a certificate of
9	registration for a motor vehicle of the first division or for a
10	motor vehicle of the second division weighing no more than
11	8,000 pounds, accompanied with payment of the registration fees
12	required under this Code from a person with disabilities or a
13	person who is deaf or hard of hearing, the Secretary of State,
14	if so requested, shall issue to such person registration plates
15	as provided for in Section 3-611, provided that the person with
16	disabilities or person who is deaf or hard of hearing must not

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1 be disgualified from obtaining a driver's license under subsection 8 of Section 6-103 of this Code, and further 2 3 provided that any person making such a request must submit a 4 statement, certified by a licensed physician, by a physician 5 assistant who has been delegated the authority to make this 6 certification by his or her supervising physician, or by an advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative 7 8 agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the 9 advanced practice nurse to make this certification, to the 10 effect that such person is a person with disabilities as 11 defined by Section 1-159.1 of this Code, or alternatively provide adequate documentation that such person has a Class 1A, 12 13 Class 2A or Type Four disability under the provisions of 14 Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act. For 15 purposes of this Section, an Illinois Disabled Person 16 Identification Card issued pursuant to Illinois the Identification Card Act indicating that the person thereon 17 18 named has a disability shall be adequate documentation of such 19 a disability.

(b) The Secretary shall issue plates under this Section to a parent or legal guardian of a person with disabilities if the person with disabilities has a Class 1A or Class 2A disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act or is a person with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1 of this Code, and does not possess a vehicle registered in his or her name, provided that the person with disabilities 09600HB3323ham001 -3- LRB096 05919 AJT 24492 a

1 relies frequently on the parent or legal quardian for 2 transportation. Only one vehicle per family may be registered under this subsection, unless the applicant can justify in 3 4 writing the need for one additional set of plates. Any person 5 requesting special plates under this subsection shall submit 6 such documentation or such physician's, physician assistant's, or advanced practice nurse's statement as is required in 7 8 subsection (a) and a statement describing the circumstances 9 qualifying for issuance of special plates under this 10 subsection. An optometrist may certify a Class 2A Visual 11 Disability, defined in Section 4A of the Illinois as Identification Card Act, for the purpose of qualifying a person 12 13 with disabilities for special plates under this subsection.

(c) The Secretary may issue a parking decal or device to a 14 15 person with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1 without 16 regard to qualification of such person with disabilities for a driver's license or registration of a vehicle by such person 17 18 with disabilities or such person's immediate family, provided 19 such person with disabilities making such a request has been 20 issued a Disabled Person Identification Card indicating that the person named thereon has a Class 1A or Class 2A disability, 21 22 or alternatively, submits a statement certified by a licensed 23 physician, or by a physician assistant or an advanced practice 24 nurse as provided in subsection (a), to the effect that such 25 person is a person with disabilities as defined by Section 26 1-159.1. An optometrist may certify a Class 2A Visual

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1 Disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois 2 Identification Card Act for the purpose of qualifying a person 3 with disabilities for a parking decal or device under this 4 subsection.

5 (d) The Secretary shall prescribe by rules and regulations certify or re-certify as 6 procedures to necessarv the eligibility of persons whose disabilities are other than 7 permanent for special plates or parking decals or devices 8 9 issued under subsections (a), (b) and (c). The Secretary of 10 State shall not require the re-certification of persons whose 11 disabilities are permanent for special plates or parking decals or devices issued under subsections (a), (b) and (c). Except as 12 13 provided under subsection (f) of this Section, no such special plates, decals or devices shall be issued by the Secretary of 14 15 State to or on behalf of any person with disabilities unless 16 such person is certified as meeting the definition of a person with disabilities pursuant to Section 1-159.1 or meeting the 17 18 requirement of a Type Four disability as provided under Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act for the period of 19 20 time that the physician, or the physician assistant or advanced 21 practice nurse as provided in subsection (a), determines the 22 applicant will have the disability, but not to exceed 6 months from the date of certification or recertification. 23

(e) Any person requesting special plates under this Section
may also apply to have the special plates personalized, as
provided under Section 3-405.1.

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1 (f) The Secretary of State, upon application, shall issue 2 disability registration plates or a parking decal to corporations, school districts, State or municipal agencies, 3 4 limited liability companies, nursing homes, convalescent 5 homes, or special education cooperatives which will transport 6 persons with disabilities. The Secretary shall prescribe by rule a means to certify or re-certify the eligibility of 7 organizations to receive disability plates or decals and to 8 9 designate which of the 2 person with disabilities emblems shall 10 be placed on qualifying vehicles.

11 (q) The Secretary of State, or his designee, may enter into other jurisdictions, including 12 agreements with foreign 13 jurisdictions, on behalf of this State relating to the extension of parking privileges by such jurisdictions to 14 15 permanently disabled residents of this State who display a 16 special license plate or parking device that contains the International symbol of access on his or her motor vehicle, and 17 to recognize such plates or devices issued by such other 18 19 State shall grant the same parking jurisdictions. This 20 privileges which are granted to disabled residents of this 21 State to any non-resident whose motor vehicle is licensed in 22 another state, district, territory or foreign country if such 23 vehicle displays the international symbol of access or a 24 distinguishing insignia on license plates or parking device 25 issued in accordance with the laws of the non-resident's state, 26 district, territory or foreign country.
