

## 96TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2009 and 2010 HB5119

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-601

from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 12-601

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that vehicles operated by a voluntary firefighter may be equipped with a siren, whistle, or bell (rather than only allowing authorized emergency or organ transplant vehicles to use a siren, whistle, or bell).

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing

  Section 12-601 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-601) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 12-601)
- 7 Sec. 12-601. Horns and warning devices.
  - (a) Every motor vehicle when operated upon a highway shall be equipped with a horn in good working order and capable of emitting sound audible under normal conditions from a distance of not less than 200 feet, but no horn or other warning device shall emit an unreasonable loud or harsh sound or a whistle. The driver of a motor vehicle shall when reasonably necessary to insure safe operation give audible warning with his horn but shall not otherwise use such horn when upon a highway.
    - (b) No vehicle shall be equipped with nor shall any person use upon a vehicle any siren, whistle, or bell, except as otherwise permitted in this section. Any authorized emergency vehicle, vehicles operated by a voluntary firefighter, or organ transport vehicle as defined in Chapter 1 of this Act may be equipped with a siren, whistle, or bell, capable of emitting sound audible under normal conditions from a distance of not less than 500 feet, but such siren, whistle or bell, shall not

- 2 emergency call or in the immediate pursuit of an actual or
- 3 suspected violator of the law in either of which events the
- 4 driver of such vehicle shall sound such siren, whistle or bell,
- 5 when necessary to warn pedestrians and other drivers of the
- 6 approach thereof.
- 7 (c) Trackless trolley coaches, as defined by Section 1-206
- 8 of this Code, and replica trolleys, as defined by Section
- 9 1-171.04 of this Code, may be equipped with a bell or bells in
- 10 lieu of a horn, and may, in addition to the requirements of
- 11 paragraph (a) of this Section, use a bell or bells for the
- 12 purpose of indicating arrival or departure at designated stops
- during the hours of scheduled operation.
