1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 5178

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend House Bill 5178 by replacing  
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by  
5 changing Sections 11-42-1, 11-42-5, and 11-54-1 as follows:

6 (65 ILCS 5/11-42-1) (from Ch. 24, par. 11-42-1)

7 Sec. 11-42-1. The corporate authorities of each  
8 municipality may license, tax, and regulate auctioneers,  
9 private detectives, demolition contractors, money changers,  
10 bankers, brokers other than insurance brokers, barbers, and the  
11 keepers or owners of lumber yards, lumber storehouses, livery  
12 stables, public scales, ice cream parlors, coffee houses,  
13 florists, detective agencies, barber shops and sellers of  
14 tickets for theatricals, shows, amusements, athletic events  
15 and other exhibitions at a place other than the theatre or  
16 location where the theatricals, shows, amusements, athletic

1 events and other exhibitions are given or exhibited. No  
2 municipality may impose a tax under this Section, or impose any  
3 other amusement or exhibition tax, on ticket sales, membership  
4 fees, or any other charges for attending exhibitions or  
5 attractions associated with a zoological park authorized under  
6 Section 40 of the Cook County Forest Preserve District Act, nor  
7 may any municipality impose a duty to collect a tax under this  
8 Section, or any other amusement or exhibition tax, on any owner  
9 or operator of a zoological park authorized under Section 40 of  
10 the Cook County Forest Preserve District Act.

13 Sec. 11-42-5. The corporate authorities of each  
14 municipality may license, tax, regulate, or prohibit hawkers,  
15 peddlers, pawnbrokers, itinerant merchants, transient vendors  
16 of merchandise, theatricals and other exhibitions, shows, and  
17 amusements and may license, tax, and regulate all places for  
18 eating or amusement. No municipality may impose a tax under  
19 this Section, or impose any other amusement or exhibition tax,  
20 on ticket sales, membership fees, or any other charges for  
21 attending exhibitions or attractions associated with a  
22 zoological park authorized under Section 40 of the Cook County  
23 Forest Preserve District Act, nor may any municipality impose a  
24 duty to collect a tax under this Section, or any other  
25 amusement or exhibition tax, on any owner or operator of a

1 zoological park authorized under Section 40 of the Cook County  
2 Forest Preserve District Act.

4 (65 ILCS 5/11-54-1) (from Ch. 24, par. 11-54-1)

5 Sec. 11-54-1. The corporate authorities of each  
6 municipality may license, tax, and regulate all athletic  
7 contests and exhibitions carried on for gain. This tax shall be  
8 based on the gross receipts derived from the sale of admission  
9 tickets, but the tax shall not exceed 3% of the gross receipts.  
10 No municipality may impose a tax under this Section, or impose  
11 any other amusement or exhibition tax, on ticket sales,  
12 membership fees, or any other charges for attending exhibitions  
13 or attractions associated with a zoological park authorized  
14 under Section 40 of the Cook County Forest Preserve District  
15 Act, nor may any municipality impose a duty to collect a tax  
16 under this Section, or any other amusement or exhibition tax,  
17 on any owner or operator of a zoological park authorized under  
18 Section 40 of the Cook County Forest Preserve District Act.
