## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 84/57

Amends the Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Practice Act. Provides that a licensed podiatrist or advanced practice nurse collaborating with a podiatrist may only order care or services concerning the foot, as defined in the Podiatric Medical Practice Act of 1987, from a licensed prosthetist or orthotist. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics
Practice Act is amended by changing Section 57 as follows:

#### 6 (225 ILCS 84/57)

7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2020)

8 Sec. 57. Limitation on provision of care and services. A 9 licensed orthotist, prosthetist, or pedorthist may provide care or services only if the care or services are provided 10 pursuant to an order from (i) a licensed physician, (ii) a 11 podiatrist, (iii) an advanced practice nurse who has a written 12 13 collaborative agreement with a collaborating physician or 14 podiatrist that specifically authorizes ordering the services of an orthotist, prosthetist or pedorthist, (iv) an advanced 15 16 practice nurse who practices in a hospital or ambulatory 17 surgical treatment center and possesses clinical privileges to order services of an orthotist, prosthetist, or pedorthist, or 18 19 (v) a physician assistant who has been delegated the authority to order the services of an orthotist, prosthetist, or 20 21 pedorthist by his or her supervising physician. A licensed 22 podiatrist or advanced practice nurse collaborating with a podiatrist may only order care or services concerning the foot, 23
