# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

### 5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

The amount of \$3,883, or so much of this 6 Section 5. 7 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2010, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose 8 in Section 5 of Article 5 of Public Act 96-0035, 9 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the 10 Office of the Architect 11 of the Capitol for 12 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the report and recommendations of the architectural, structural, 13 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. 14 is for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol 15 Building. 16
