1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, In the United States, approximately 12,000 women 2 3 each year are diagnosed with cervical cancer; approximately 4 4,000 women each year die from cervical cancer in the U.S.; and WHEREAS, Half of the women diagnosed with the disease are 5 6 between 35 and 55 years of age; approximately 20% of diagnoses 7 are made in women older than 65; and 8 WHEREAS, Cervical cancer rates vary, but occur more often 9 African-American Hispanic women in women and than in non-Hispanic white women; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Cervical cancer is usually a slow-growing cancer 12 that may not have symptoms; cervical cancer is primarily caused 13 by the human papillomavirus (HPV), but can be detected by Papanicolaou test (Pap tests) or other early detection tests; 14 15 and 16 WHEREAS, The Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer Program 17 provides access to screening and treatment options, including 18 free pelvic exams and Pap tests for qualifying uninsured women; 19 and

WHEREAS, Detecting cervical cancer in its earliest stages

- 2 WHEREAS, Over 90% of women diagnosed with cervical cancer
- 3 can survive when the cancer is localized and is caught in its
- 4 early stages; therefore, be it
