1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 10. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station located in Sangamon County, Illinois using Illinois coal to generate electricity for the purposes specified in the Illinois Coal and Energy Development Bond Act and Section 8.1

- of the Energy Conservation and Coal Development Bond Act.
- 2 Section 15. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
- 3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
- 4 Development Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
- 5 Economic Opportunity to the owner of a generating station
- 6 located in Washington County, Illinois using Illinois coal to
- 7 generate electricity for the purposes specified in the
- 8 Illinois Coal and Energy Development Bond Act and Section 8.1
- 9 of the Energy Conservation and Coal Development Bond Act.
- 10 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
- 11 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
