- 5 WHEREAS, She was born the middle child of three girls on 6 December 18, 1919, in East St. Louis to C.T. and Emma Edwards 7 Nash; as a native of East St. Louis, she attended St. Augustine 8 Grade School and graduated from Lincoln School; and
 - WHEREAS, Fredericka lived a life of academic achievements through her acumen in higher education; she was a member of the Radiance Center for Spiritual Living in Belleville; Fredericka was the owner of Nash Funeral Home, the area's oldest black owned funeral business; she, along with her sisters M. Frances and Claudia M., from birth, began their lives in funeral service under the guidance of their father, C.T. Nash; and
