- 8 (a) A person commits copper theft when, without the consent

- (2) which is manufactured, sold, or used as:

15	\$10,000 in value, is a Class 2 felony.
16	(4) Copper theft exceeding \$500 in value if the theft

18	theft was of governmental property is a Class 1 felony.
19	(5) Copper theft exceeding \$10,000 in value is a Class
20	1 felony.
