## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

21	Section 20. The amounts appropriated for repairs and
22	maintenance, and other capital improvements in Section 15 for
23	repairs and maintenance, roof repairs and/or replacements and

- 1 miscellaneous capital improvements at the Department's
- 2 various institutions are to include construction,
- 3 reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of
- 4 capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials
- 5 and all other expenses required for roof and other types of
- 6 repairs and maintenance, capital improvements, and purchase
- 7 of land.
- 8 No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred
- 9 for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements
- 10 from appropriations made in Section 15 of this Article until
- 11 after the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing
- 12 by the Governor.
- 13 Section 25. The sum of \$40,100, or so much thereof as
- 14 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
- Juvenile Justice from the General Revenue Fund for costs and
- 16 expenses associated with payment of statewide
- 17 hospitalization.
- 18 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
- 19 2011.
