### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 405/405-335

Amends the Department of Central Management Services Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Provides that the Illinois Transparency and Accountability Portal shall include members of the General Assembly in its database of current State employees and individual consultants. Provides that the database shall also provide insurance and pension benefits information. Provides that all information on the ITAP shall be available to the user to download in spreadsheet or CSV format. Provides that the ITAP shall include a public forum and a commenting interface. Effective January 1, 2012.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Central Management Services
Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by
changing Section 405-335 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 405/405-335)

8 Sec. 405-335. Illinois Transparency and Accountability 9 Portal (ITAP).

(a) The Department, within 12 months after the effective 10 date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly, shall 11 establish and maintain a website, known as the Illinois 12 13 Transparency and Accountability Portal (ITAP), with а 14 full-time webmaster tasked with compiling and updating the ITAP database with information received from all State agencies as 15 16 defined in this Section.

(b) For purposes of this Section:

18 "State agency" means (i) the offices of the constitutional 19 officers identified in Article V of the Illinois Constitution, 20 executive agencies, and departments, boards, commissions, and 21 Authorities under the Governor and (ii) for the purposes of 22 paragraph (1) of subsection (c) only, State agencies under the 23 jurisdiction of the Legislative Ethics Commission. 1 "Contracts" means payment obligations with vendors on file
2 with the Office of the Comptroller to purchase goods and
3 services exceeding \$10,000 in value (or, in the case of
4 professional or artistic services, exceeding \$5,000 in value).

5 "Appropriation" means line-item detail of spending 6 approved by the General Assembly and Governor, categorized by 7 object of expenditure.

8 "Individual consultants" means temporary workers eligible9 to receive State benefits paid on a State payroll.

10 "Recipients" means State agencies receiving 11 appropriations.

12 (c) The ITAP shall provide direct access to each of the 13 following:

14 (1) A database of all current <u>and retired members of</u>
 15 <u>the General Assembly</u>, State employees, and individual
 16 consultants, except sworn law enforcement officers, sorted
 17 separately by:

(i) Name.

19 (ii) Employing State agency.

20 (iii) Employing State division.

21 (iv) Employment position title.

(v) Current pay rate and year-to-date pay\_
 <u>including insurance benefits provided by the State</u>.

24(vi)Currentyear-to-datepensionbenefits25contributed by the State under the Illinois Pension26Code.

(2) A database of all current State expenditures,
 sorted separately by agency, category, recipient, and
 Representative District.

4 (3) A database of all development assistance 5 reportable pursuant to the Corporate Accountability for 6 Tax Expenditures Act, sorted separately by tax credit 7 category, taxpayer, and Representative District.

8 (4) A database of all revocations and suspensions of 9 State occupation and use tax certificates of registration 10 and all revocations and suspensions of State professional 11 licenses, sorted separately by name, geographic location, 12 and certificate of registration number or license number, 13 applicable. Professional license revocations and as 14 suspensions shall be posted only if resulting from a 15 failure to pay taxes, license fees, or child support.

(5) A database of all current State contracts, sorted
 separately by contractor name, awarding officer or agency,
 contract value, and goods or services provided.

19 (6) A database of all employees hired after the 20 effective date of this amendatory Act of 2010, sorted 21 searchably by each of the following at the time of 22 employment:

(i) Name.

(vii) Rutan status.

4 (viii) Status of position as subject to collective

(vi) County of employment location.

7 (ix) Employment status as probationary, trainee,
8 intern, certified, or exempt from certification.

(x) Status as a military veteran.

(d) The ITAP shall include all information required to be published by subsection (c) of this Section that is available to the Department in a format the Department can compile and publish on the ITAP. The Department shall update the ITAP as additional information becomes available in a format that can be compiled and published on the ITAP by the Department.

(e) Each State agency shall cooperate with the Department
 in furnishing the information necessary for the implementation
 of this Section within a timeframe specified by the Department.
 (f) All information published on the ITAP as required by
 subsection (c) shall be available to the user to download in a
 CSV (comma-separated values) or spreadsheet format.

22 (g) The ITAP shall include a public forum and a commenting 23 interface on which users may discuss and comment on individual 24 <u>expense items.</u>

25 (h) The ITAP shall provide direct access to contact
 26 information for each State agency and each member of the
