8	(a) Findings and purpose. Far too often the sacrifices of	
9	women veterans are overlooked. This f	requently leads to women
10	veterans being left out of veter	ans' organizations. In
11	addition, most veterans services ar	e targeted to men. The
12	purpose of this Section is to establis	h a task force to examine
13	the needs of women veterans with resp	ect to issues including,
14	but not limited to, compensation, r	ehabilitation, outreach,
15	breast and cervical cancer screenings,	health care, and issues
16	facing women veterans in the community	, and to offer solutions

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1	on how best to alleviate these needs.
2	(b) Composition of Task Force. The Department of Veterans'
3	Affairs shall provide administrative support to the Task Force.
4	The Task Force shall be comprised of women veterans appointed
5	as follows:
6	(1) Five members appointed by the Governor.
7	(2) One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
8	Representatives.
9	(3) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
10	House of Representatives.
11	(4) One member appointed by the President of the
12	Senate.
13	(5) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
14	Senate.
15	(c) Vacancies. Vacancies in the Task Force shall be filled
16	by the initial appointing authority.
17	(d) Compensation. Members of the Task Force shall serve
18	without compensation, but may be reimbursed for necessary
19	expenses incurred in performing duties associated with the Task
20	Force.
21	(e) Duties. The Task Force shall examine the needs of women
22	veterans with respect to issues including, but not limited to,
23	compensation, rehabilitation, outreach, breast and cervical
24	cancer screenings, health care, and issues facing women
25	veterans in the community, and offer solutions on how best to

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1	(f) Reporting. By July 1, 2012, the Task Force shall
2	present a report of its findings to the Governor, the Director
3	of Veterans' Affairs, and the Secretary of the United States
4	Department of Veterans Affairs.
5	(g) Repeal. This Section is repealed on July 1, 2012.

6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 7 becoming law.".
