### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-610.2

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that provisions prohibiting the use of electronic communication devices while driving shall also apply to bicycles. Exempts bicyclists using electronic communication devices in hands-free or voice-activated mode and bicyclists using devices while parked on the shoulder of a roadway. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 12-610.2 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.2)

7 Sec. 12-610.2. Electronic communication devices.

8 (a) As used in this Section:

"Electronic communication device" means an electronic 9 device, including but not limited to a wireless telephone, 10 personal digital assistant, or a portable or mobile computer 11 12 while being used for the purpose of composing, reading, or 13 sending an electronic message, but does not include a global 14 positioning system or navigation system or a device that is physically or electronically integrated into the 15 motor 16 vehicle.

17 "Electronic message" means a self-contained piece of 18 digital communication that is designed or intended to be 19 transmitted between physical devices. "Electronic message" 20 includes, but is not limited to electronic mail, a text 21 message, an instant message, or a command or request to access 22 an Internet site.

(b) A person may not operate a motor vehicle or bicycle on

a roadway while using an electronic communication device to
 compose, send, or read an electronic message.

(c) A violation of this Section is an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles.

(d) This Section does not apply to:

6 (1) a law enforcement officer or operator of an 7 emergency vehicle while performing his or her official 8 duties;

9 (2) a driver using an electronic communication device 10 for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation 11 and continued communication with emergency personnel 12 during the emergency situation;

13 (3) a driver <u>or bicyclist</u> using an electronic 14 communication device in hands-free or voice-activated 15 mode;

16 (4) a driver of a commercial motor vehicle reading a 17 message displayed on a permanently installed communication 18 device designed for a commercial motor vehicle with a 19 screen that does not exceed 10 inches tall by 10 inches 20 wide in size;

(5) a driver <u>or bicyclist</u> using an electronic communication device while parked on the shoulder of a roadway; or

(6) a driver using an electronic communication device
when the vehicle is stopped due to normal traffic being
obstructed and the driver has the motor vehicle
