1 HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 90

2 WHEREAS, It has been many years since there has been a 3 systematic study of Illinois' correctional and criminal 4 justice system and there exists a need for that study; and

WHEREAS, A study of Illinois' criminal justice and correctional system is necessary to enhance public safety, reduce victimization, reduce recidivism, hold offenders more accountable, enhance probation, mandatory supervised release, and parole supervision, and better manage a growing prison population through increasing public safety, improving rehabilitation, and lowering State expense; and

12 WHEREAS, A study and formulation of recommendations for 13 criminal justice structural changes can be best carried out 14 through an established Task Force; and

WHEREAS, Enactment of Task Force recommendations, if deemed appropriate at the 2013 session of the General Assembly, is best carried out through a deliberative and specific legislative process; therefore, be it

 - (12) a representative from the Cook County Public Defender's Office appointed by the Cook County Public Defender:
 - (13) a representative of the State Appellate Defender appointed by the State Appellate Defender;
 - (14) a representative from the Cook County Circuit Court Clerk's Office appointed by the Cook County Circuit Court Clerk:
 - (15) a representative of the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts appointed by the Director of that Office:
 - (16) a representative of the Cook County Chief Judge's Office appointed by the Chief Judge of the Cook County Circuit:
 - a member of the Illinois Sentencing Policy (17)Advisory Council appointed by the Governor;
 - (18) a representative from each department and agency of the State having involvement with the State criminal justice system appointed by the Governor; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall: 23

(1) choose its chair and other officers as it deems appropriate;

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- (2) hold hearings from persons involved or impacted by the criminal justice system; and
- 3 (3) study the Illinois criminal justice and correctional system and make recommendations to 4 the 5 General Assembly for structural changes in the Illinois criminal justice and correctional system with the goals of 6 7 enhancing public safety, reducing victimization 8 recidivism, holding offenders more accountable, enhancing 9 probation, mandatory supervised release, and 10 supervision, and better managing a growing 11 population through increasing public safety, improving 12 rehabilitation, and lowering State expense; and be it further 13
 - RESOLVED, That the Department of Corrections shall provide administrative support as needed to fulfill the duties of the Task Force; and be it further
 - RESOLVED, That members of the Task Force shall receive no additional compensation for their services on the Task Force but may be reimbursed by appropriations made by the General Assembly for their ordinary and necessary expenses; and be it further
 - RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall complete its work and report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly

1 no later than November 1, 2012.
