- 10 responsibility for facilities, real estate, and claims at both
- 11 ComEd and Philadelphia-based sister company PECO Energy; and
- WHEREAS, John T. Hooker is noted for his many "Hookerisms"
- of which one highlights his professional career, "will make it
- 14 work"; and
- WHEREAS, He has served in numerous ComEd departments for 44
- 16 years, holding management positions in industrial relations,
