1 AN ACT concerning revenue.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Film Production Services Tax Credit Act of
2008 is amended by changing Section 10 and by adding Section 44
as follows:

7 (35 ILCS 16/10)

8 Sec. 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:

9 "Accredited production" means: (i) for productions commencing before May 1, 2006, a film, video, or television 10 production that has been certified by the Department in which 11 12 the aggregate Illinois labor expenditures included in the cost of the production, in the period that ends 12 months after the 13 14 time principal filming or taping of the production began, exceed \$100,000 for productions of 30 minutes or longer, or 15 16 \$50,000 for productions of less than 30 minutes; and (ii) for 17 productions commencing on or after May 1, 2006, a film, video, or television production that has been certified by the 18 19 Department in which the Illinois production spending included 20 in the cost of production in the period that ends 12 months 21 after the time principal filming or taping of the production 22 began exceeds \$100,000 for productions of 30 minutes or longer or exceeds \$50,000 for productions of less than 30 minutes. 23

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"Accredited production" does not include a production that: 1 2 (1) is news, current events, or public programming, or 3 a program that includes weather or market reports; (2) is a talk show; 4 5 (3)is a production in respect of a game, 6 questionnaire, or contest; 7 (4) is a sports event or activity; 8 (5) is a gala presentation or awards show; 9 (6) is a finished production that solicits funds; 10 (7) is a production produced by a film production 11 company if records, as required by 18 U.S.C. 2257, are to 12 be maintained by that film production company with respect 13 to any performer portrayed in that single media or 14 multimedia program; or 15 (8) is a production produced primarily for industrial, 16 corporate, or institutional purposes. 17 "Accredited animated production" means an accredited production in which movement and characters' performances are 18 19 created using a frame-by-frame technique and a significant 20 number of major characters are animated. Motion capture by 21 itself is not an animation technique. 22 "Accredited production certificate" means a certificate

production located within the State of Illinois and that (i) owns the copyright in the accredited production throughout the Illinois production period or (ii) has contracted directly with the owner of the copyright in the accredited production or a person acting on behalf of the owner to provide services for the production, where the owner of the copyright is not an eligible production corporation.

8 "Credit" means:

9 (1) for an accredited production approved by the 10 Department on or before January 1, 2005 and commencing 11 before May 1, 2006, the amount equal to 25% of the Illinois 12 expenditure approved by the Department. labor The applicant is deemed to have paid, on its balance due day 13 14 for the year, an amount equal to 25% of its qualified 15 Illinois labor expenditure for the tax year. For Illinois 16 labor expenditures generated by the employment of 17 residents of geographic areas of high poverty or high unemployment, as determined by the Department, in an 18 19 accredited production commencing before May 1, 2006 and approved by the Department after January 1, 2005, the 20 applicant shall receive an enhanced credit of 10% in 21 22 addition to the 25% credit; and

(2) for an accredited production commencing on or after
May 1, 2006, the amount equal to:

25 (i) 20% of the Illinois production spending for the26 taxable year; plus

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(ii) 15% of the Illinois labor expenditures 1 2 generated by the employment of residents of geographic 3 areas of high poverty or high unemployment, as determined by the Department; and 4 5 (3) for an accredited production commencing on or after 6 January 1, 2009, the amount equal to: 7 (i) 30% of the Illinois production spending for the 8 taxable year; plus 9 (ii) 15% of the Illinois labor expenditures 10 generated by the employment of residents of geographic 11 areas of high poverty or high unemployment, as 12 determined by the Department. 13 "Department" means the Department of Commerce and Economic 14 Opportunity. "Director" means the Director of Commerce and Economic 15 16 Opportunity. 17 "Illinois labor expenditure" means salary or wages paid to employees of the applicant for services on the accredited 18 19 production; 20 То qualify as an Illinois labor expenditure, the 21 expenditure must be: 22 (1) Reasonable in the circumstances. 23 (2) Included in the federal income tax basis of the 24 property. 25 (3) Incurred by the applicant for services on or after 26 January 1, 2004.

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1 (4) Incurred for the production stages of the 2 accredited production, from the final script stage to the 3 end of the post-production stage.

4 (5) Limited to the first \$25,000 of wages paid or 5 incurred to each employee of a production commencing before 6 May 1, 2006 and the first \$100,000 of wages paid or 7 incurred to each employee of a production commencing on or 8 after May 1, 2006.

9 (6) For a production commencing before May 1, 2006, 10 exclusive of the salary or wages paid to or incurred for 11 the 2 highest paid employees of the production.

12 (7) Directly attributable to the accredited 13 production.

14 (8) (Blank). Paid in the tax year for which the
15 applicant is claiming the credit or no later than 60 days
16 after the end of the tax year.

17 (9) Paid to persons resident in Illinois at the time18 the payments were made.

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(10) Paid for services rendered in Illinois.

20 "Illinois production spending" means the expenses incurred 21 by the applicant for an accredited production, including, 22 without limitation, all of the following:

(1) expenses to purchase, from vendors within
Illinois, tangible personal property that is used in the
accredited production;

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(2) expenses to acquire services, from vendors in

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Illinois, for film production, editing, or processing; and

(3) the compensation, not to exceed \$100,000 for any
one employee, for contractual or salaried employees who are
Illinois residents performing services with respect to the
accredited production.

6 "Qualified production facility" means stage facilities in 7 the State in which television shows and films are or are 8 intended to be regularly produced and that contain at least one 9 sound stage of at least 15,000 square feet.

10 Rulemaking authority to implement this amendatory Act of 11 the 95th General Assembly, if any, is conditioned on the rules 12 being adopted in accordance with all provisions of the Illinois 13 Administrative Procedure Act and all rules and procedures of 14 the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules; any purported rule 15 not so adopted, for whatever reason, is unauthorized.

18 Sec. 44. Accredited animated productions. Each applicant requesting credits for an accredited animated production 19 commencing on or after July 1, 2010 may make an application to 20 21 the Department in each taxable year beginning with the taxable year in which the production commences and ending with the 22 23 taxable year in which production is complete, provided that no 24 credit may be claimed under this Section for a taxable year ending prior to December 31, 2012. 25

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
