2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 1321 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by adding

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8	Section 10. The Illinois Premise Alert Program (PAP) Act is

11	Sec. 10. Definitions. As used in this Act:
12	"Disability" means an individual's physical or mental
13	impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major
14	life activities; a record of such impairment; or when the

- individual is 1 regarded as having such an impairment.
- 2 "Disability" includes, but is not limited to, a medical
- 3 impairment that requires the use of pressurized oxygen.
- 4 "Special needs individuals" means those individuals who
- 5 have or are at increased risk for a chronic physical,
- 6 developmental, behavioral, or emotional condition and who also
- require health and related services of a type or amount beyond 7
- 8 that required by individuals generally. "Special needs
- 9 individual" includes, but is not limited to, an individual with
- 10 a medical impairment that requires the use of pressurized
- 11 oxygen.
- "Public safety agency" means a functional division of a 12
- public agency that provides firefighting, police, medical, or 13
- 14 other emergency services.
- 15 "Computer aided dispatch" or "CAD" means a database
- 16 maintained by the public safety agency or public safety
- answering point used in conjunction with 9-1-1 caller data. 17
- "Premise Alert Program" or "PAP" means a computer aided 18
- 19 dispatch database of individuals with special needs maintained
- 20 by public safety agencies.

- 23 Sec. 15. Reporting of Special Needs Individuals.
- 24 Public safety agencies and suppliers of oxygen
- containers used for medical purposes shall make reasonable 25

- 1 efforts to publicize the Premise Alert Program (PAP) database.
- 2 Means of publicizing the database include, but are not limited
- 3 to, pamphlets and websites.
- 4 (b) Families, caregivers, or the individuals with
- 5 disabilities or special needs may contact their local law
- 6 enforcement agency or fire department or fire protection
- 7 district.
- 8 (c) Public safety workers are to be cognizant <del>cognitive</del> of
- 9 special needs individuals they may come across when they
- 10 respond to calls. If workers are able to identify individuals
- 11 who have special needs, they shall try to ascertain as
- 12 specifically as possible what that special need might be. The
- 13 public safety worker should attempt to verify the special need
- as provided in item (2) of subsection (d).
- 15 (d) The disabled individual's name, date of birth, phone
- number, and residential address or place of employment, and a
- 17 <u>description of whether oxygen canisters are kept at that</u>
- 18 <u>location for medical purposes</u> should also be obtained for
- 19 possible entry into the PAP database.
- 20 (1) Whenever possible, it is preferable that written
- 21 permission is obtained from a parent, quardian, family
- 22 member, or caregiver of the individual themselves prior to
- being entered into the PAP database.
- 24 (2) No individual may be entered into a PAP database
- 25 unless the special need has been verified. Acceptable means
- of verifying a special need for purposes of this program

- 1 shall include statements by:
- (A) the individual, 2
- 3 (B) family members,
- 4 (C) friends,
- 5 (D) caregivers, or
- 6 medical personnel familiar with (E) the
- individual. 7
- (e) For public safety agencies that share the same CAD 8
- 9 database, information collected by one agency serviced by the
- 10 CAD database is to be disseminated to all agencies utilizing
- that database. 11
- 12 (f) Information received at an incorrect public safety
- 13 agency shall be accepted and forwarded to the correct agency as
- 14 soon as possible.
- 15 (g) All information entered into the PAP database must be
- 16 updated every 2 years or when such information changes.
