Amend Senate Bill 1613 by replacing 2 everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by adding 4 Sections 1-109.3 and 1-113.18 as follows: 5 6 (40 ILCS 5/1-109.3) 7 Sec. 1-109.3. Training requirement for pension trustees. (a) All elected and appointed trustees under Article 3 and 8 4 of this Code must participate in a mandatory trustee 10 certification training seminar that consists of at least 32 11 hours of initial trustee certification at a training facility

that is accredited and affiliated with a State of Illinois

certified college or university. This training must include

(1) Duties and liabilities of a fiduciary under Article

without limitation all of the following:

1 of the Illinois Pension Code.

- 1 (2) Adjudication of pension claims.
- 2 (3) Basic accounting and actuarial training.
- 3 (4) Trustee ethics.

- 4 (5) The Illinois Open Meetings Act.
- 5 (6) The Illinois Freedom of Information Act.

The training required under this subsection (a) must be completed within the first 2 years after the year that a trustee takes office is elected or appointed under an Article 3 or 4 pension fund. The elected and appointed trustees of an Article 3 or 4 pension fund who are police officers (as defined in Section 3-106 of this Code) or firefighters (as defined in Section 4-106 of this Code) or are employed by the municipality shall be permitted time away from their duties to attend such training without reduction of accrued leave or benefit time. Active or appointed trustees serving on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly shall not be required to attend the training required under this subsection (a).

(b) <u>Upon completion of</u>, and in <u>Im</u> addition to, the initial trustee certification training required under subsection (a), all elected and appointed trustees under Article 3 and 4 of this Code, including trustees serving on the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly, shall also complete at least an additional participate in a minimum of 16 hours of continuing trustee education <u>during</u> (i) the 2 years following the date by which the training required under

- 1 subsection (a) must be completed and (ii) every 2 years
- thereafter each year after the first year that the trustee is 2
- elected or appointed. Ethics training completed under Section 3
- 4 1-113.18 may be applied toward the hours required under this

- (d) Any board member who does not timely complete the 8

- 23 retirement system, pension fund, or investment board created
- 24 under this Code must attend ethics training of at least 8 hours
- 25 every 2 years per year. The training required under this

1 Section shall include training on ethics, fiduciary duty, and investment issues and any other curriculum that the board of 2 the retirement system, pension fund, or investment board 3 4 establishes as being important for the administration of the 5 retirement system, pension fund, or investment board. The Supreme Court of Illinois shall be responsible for ethics 6 training and curriculum for judges designated by the Court to 7 serve as members of a retirement system, pension fund, or 8 9 investment board. Each board shall annually certify its 10 members' compliance with this Section and submit an annual 11 certification to the Division of Insurance of the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation. Judges shall annually 12 13 certify compliance with the ethics training requirement and shall submit an annual certification to the Chief Justice of 14 15 the Supreme Court of Illinois. Ethics training completed under 16 this Section may be applied toward the continuing education requirement in subsection (b) of Section 1-109.3. 17
