8	Sec. 6-15. No alcoholic liquors shall be sold c	r delivered
9	in any building belonging to or under the control c	of the State
10	or any political subdivision thereof except as provi	ded in this
11	Act. The corporate authorities of any city	, village,
12	incorporated town or township may provide by	ordinance,
13	however, that alcoholic liquor may be sold or deliv	vered in any
14	specifically designated building belonging to or	under the
15	control of the municipality or township, or in a	ny building
16	located on land under the control of the municipalit	y; provided

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1 such township complies with all applicable that local 2 ordinances in any incorporated area of the township. Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold under the authority of a 3 4 special use permit on any property owned by a conservation 5 district organized under the Conservation District Act, 6 provided that (i) the alcoholic liquor is sold only at an event authorized by the governing board of the conservation district, 7 8 (ii) the issuance of the special use permit is authorized by the local liquor control commissioner of the territory in which 9 10 the property is located, and (iii) the special use permit 11 authorizes the sale of alcoholic liquor for one day or less. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at any airport 12 13 belonging to or under the control of a municipality of more than 25,000 inhabitants, or in any building or on any golf 14 15 course owned by a park district organized under the Park 16 District Code, subject to the approval of the governing board of the district, or in any building or on any golf course owned 17 by a forest preserve district organized under the Downstate 18 Forest Preserve District Act, subject to the approval of the 19 20 governing board of the district, or on the grounds within 500 feet of any building owned by a forest preserve district 21 22 organized under the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act 23 during times when food is dispensed for consumption within 500 24 feet of the building from which the food is dispensed, subject 25 to the approval of the governing board of the district, or in a 26 building owned by a Local Mass Transit District organized under

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1 the Local Mass Transit District Act, subject to the approval of the governing Board of the District, or in Bicentennial Park, 2 or on the premises of the City of Mendota Lake Park located 3 4 adjacent to Route 51 in Mendota, Illinois, or on the premises 5 of Camden Park in Milan, Illinois, or in the community center 6 owned by the City of Loves Park that is located at 1000 River Park Drive in Loves Park, Illinois, or, in connection with the 7 8 operation of an established food serving facility during times 9 when food is dispensed for consumption on the premises, and at 10 the following aquarium and museums located in public parks: Art 11 Institute of Chicago, Chicago Academy of Sciences, Chicago Historical Society, Field Museum of Natural History, Museum of 12 13 Science and Industry, DuSable Museum of African American History, John G. Shedd Aquarium and Adler Planetarium, or at 14 15 Lakeview Museum of Arts and Sciences in Peoria, or in 16 connection with the operation of the facilities of the Chicago Zoological Society or the Chicago Horticultural Society on land 17 18 owned by the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, or on any land used for a golf course or for recreational purposes owned 19 20 by the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, subject to the control of the Forest Preserve District Board of Commissioners 21 22 and applicable local law, provided that dram shop liability 23 insurance is provided at maximum coverage limits so as to hold 24 the District harmless from all financial loss, damage, and 25 harm, or in any building located on land owned by the Chicago 26 Park District if approved by the Park District Commissioners,

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or on any land used for a golf course or for recreational 1 purposes and owned by the Illinois International Port District 2 if approved by the District's governing board, or at any 3 4 airport, golf course, faculty center, or facility in which 5 conference and convention type activities take place belonging 6 to or under control of any State university or public community college district, provided that with respect to a facility for 7 8 conference and convention type activities alcoholic liquors 9 shall be limited to the use of the convention or conference 10 participants or participants in cultural, political or 11 educational activities held in such facilities, and provided further that the faculty or staff of the State university or a 12 13 public community college district, or members of an organization of students, alumni, faculty or staff of the State 14 15 university or a public community college district are active 16 participants in the conference or convention, or in Memorial Stadium on the campus of the University of Illinois at 17 Urbana-Champaign during games in which the Chicago Bears 18 19 professional football team is playing in that stadium during 20 the renovation of Soldier Field, not more than one and a half hours before the start of the game and not after the end of the 21 22 third quarter of the game, or in the Pavilion Facility on the 23 campus of the University of Illinois at Chicago during games in 24 which the Chicago Storm professional soccer team is playing in 25 that facility, not more than one and a half hours before the 26 start of the game and not after the end of the third quarter of 09700SB1835ham002 -5- LF

1 the game, or in the Pavilion Facility on the campus of the 2 University of Illinois at Chicago during games in which the 3 WNBA professional women's basketball team is playing in that 4 facility, not more than one and a half hours before the start 5 of the game and not after the 10-minute mark of the second half 6 of the game, or by a catering establishment which has rented facilities from a board of trustees of a public community 7 8 college district, or in a restaurant that is operated by a 9 commercial tenant in the North Campus Parking Deck building 10 that (1) is located at 1201 West University Avenue, Urbana, 11 Illinois and (2) is owned by the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, or, if approved by the District board, 12 13 on land owned by the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago and leased to others for a term of at least 20 years. 14 15 Nothing in this Section precludes the sale or delivery of 16 alcoholic liquor in the form of original packaged goods in premises located at 500 S. Racine in Chicago belonging to the 17 18 University of Illinois and used primarily as a grocery store by a commercial tenant during the term of a lease that predates 19 20 University's acquisition of the premises; but the the 21 University shall have no power or authority to renew, transfer, 22 or extend the lease with terms allowing the sale of alcoholic 23 liquor; and the sale of alcoholic liquor shall be subject to 24 all local laws and regulations. After the acquisition by 25 Winnebago County of the property located at 404 Elm Street in 26 Rockford, a commercial tenant who sold alcoholic liquor at

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1 retail on a portion of the property under a valid license at 2 the time of the acquisition may continue to do so for so long 3 as the tenant and the County may agree under existing or future leases, subject to all local laws and regulations regarding the 4 5 sale of alcoholic liquor. Each facility shall provide dram shop 6 liability in maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save harmless the State, municipality, State university, airport, 7 golf course, faculty center, facility in which conference and 8 9 convention type activities take place, park district, Forest 10 District, public community college district, Preserve 11 aquarium, museum, or sanitary district from all financial loss, damage or harm. Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in 12 13 buildings of golf courses owned by municipalities in connection with the operation of an established food serving facility 14 15 during times when food is dispensed for consumption upon the 16 premises. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in any building owned by a fire protection district 17 organized under the Fire Protection District Act, provided that 18 such delivery and sale is approved by the board of trustees of 19 20 the district, and provided further that such delivery and sale is limited to fundraising events and to a maximum of 6 events 21 22 per year.

Alcoholic liquors may be served or sold in buildings under the control of the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois for events that the Board may determine are public events and not related student activities. The Board of 09700SB1835ham002 -7- LRB097 10002 ASK 56366 a

1 Trustees shall issue a written policy within 6 months of the 2 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 95th General 3 Assembly concerning the types of events that would be eligible 4 for an exemption. Thereafter, the Board of Trustees may issue 5 revised, updated, new, or amended policies as it deems 6 necessary and appropriate. In preparing its written policy, the Board of Trustees shall, among other factors it considers 7 relevant and important, give consideration to the following: 8 9 (i) whether the event is a student activity or student related 10 activity; (ii) whether the physical setting of the event is 11 conducive to control of liquor sales and distribution; (iii) the ability of the event operator to ensure that the sale or 12 13 serving of alcoholic liquors and the demeanor of the 14 participants are in accordance with State law and University 15 policies; (iv) regarding the anticipated attendees at the 16 event, the relative proportion of individuals under the age of 21 to individuals age 21 or older; (v) the ability of the venue 17 operator to prevent the sale or distribution of alcoholic 18 19 liquors to individuals under the age of 21; (vi) whether the 20 event prohibits participants from removing alcoholic beverages 21 from the venue; and (vii) whether the event prohibits 22 participants from providing their own alcoholic liquors to the 23 venue. In addition, any policy submitted by the Board of 24 Trustees to the Illinois Liquor Control Commission must require 25 that any event at which alcoholic liquors are served or sold in buildings under the control of the Board of Trustees shall 26

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1 require the prior written approval of the Office of the 2 Chancellor for the University campus where the event is 3 located. The Board of Trustees shall submit its policy, and any 4 subsequently revised, updated, new, or amended policies, to the 5 Illinois Liquor Control Commission, and any University event, 6 or location for an event, exempted under such policies shall 7 apply for a license under the applicable Sections of this Act.

8 Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold at retail in the Dorchester Senior Business Center owned by the Village of 9 10 Dolton if the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in 11 connection with organized functions for which the planned attendance is 20 or more persons, and if the person or facility 12 13 selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram 14 shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold 15 harmless the Village of Dolton and the State from all financial 16 loss, damage and harm.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in any building used as an Illinois State Armory provided:

(i) the Adjutant General's written consent to the
issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such
building is filed with the Commission;

(ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with organized functions held on special occasions;

(iii) the organized function is one for which the
 planned attendance is 25 or more persons; and

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1 (iv) the facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic 2 liquors has provided dram shop liability insurance in 3 maximum limits so as to save harmless the facility and the 4 State from all financial loss, damage or harm.

5 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in 6 the Chicago Civic Center, provided that:

7 (i) the written consent of the Public Building
8 Commission which administers the Chicago Civic Center is
9 filed with the Commission;

10 (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in 11 connection with organized functions held on special 12 occasions;

13 (iii) the organized function is one for which the 14 planned attendance is 25 or more persons;

(iv) the facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Civic Center, the City of Chicago and the State from all financial loss, damage or harm; and

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(v) all applicable local ordinances are complied with.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered or sold in any building belonging to or under the control of any city, village or incorporated town where more than 75% of the physical properties of the building is used for commercial or recreational purposes, and the building is located upon a pier extending into or over the waters of a navigable lake or stream 09700SB1835ham002 -10- LRB097 10002 ASK 56366 a

1 or on the shore of a navigable lake or stream. Alcoholic liquor may be sold in buildings under the control of the Department of 2 Natural Resources when written consent to the issuance of a 3 4 license to sell alcoholic liquor in such buildings is filed 5 with the Commission by the Department of Natural Resources. Alcoholic liquor may be served or delivered in buildings and 6 facilities under the control of the Department of Natural 7 8 Resources upon the written approval of the Director of Natural 9 Resources acting as the controlling government authority. The 10 Director of Natural Resources may specify conditions on that 11 approval, including but not limited to requirements for insurance and hours of operation. Notwithstanding any other 12 13 provision of this Act, alcoholic liquor sold by a United States 14 Army Corps of Engineers or Department of Natural Resources 15 concessionaire who was operating on June 1, 1991 for 16 on-premises consumption only is not subject to the provisions of Articles IV and IX. Beer and wine may be sold on the 17 premises of the Joliet Park District Stadium owned by the 18 19 Joliet Park District when written consent to the issuance of a 20 license to sell beer and wine in such premises is filed with 21 the local liquor commissioner by the Joliet Park District. Beer 22 and wine may be sold in buildings on the grounds of State veterans' homes when written consent to the issuance of a 23 24 license to sell beer and wine in such buildings is filed with 25 the Commission by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and the 26 facility shall provide dram shop liability in maximum insurance

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1 coverage limits so as to save the facility harmless from all 2 financial loss, damage or harm. Such liquors may be delivered 3 to and sold at any property owned or held under lease by a 4 Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority or Metropolitan 5 Exposition and Auditorium Authority.

6 Beer and wine may be sold and dispensed at professional sporting events and at professional concerts and other 7 8 entertainment events conducted on premises owned by the Forest Preserve District of Kane County, subject to the control of the 9 10 District Commissioners and applicable local law, provided that 11 dram shop liability insurance is provided at maximum coverage limits so as to hold the District harmless from all financial 12 13 loss, damage and harm.

Nothing in this Section shall preclude the sale or delivery of beer and wine at a State or county fair or the sale or delivery of beer or wine at a city fair in any otherwise lawful manner.

18 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in 19 State parks under the control of the Department of Natural 20 Resources, provided:

a. the State park has overnight lodging facilities with
some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight
lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve
complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,

b. consent to the issuance of a license to sellalcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with the

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commission by the Department of Natural Resources, and

c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the State park 2 3 lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours from 11 o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight. 4 5 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, alcoholic liquor sold by the State park or restaurant concessionaire 6 is not subject to the provisions of Articles IV and IX. 7

8 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings on 9 properties under the control of the Historic Sites and 10 Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or 11 the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum provided:

12 a. the property has overnight lodging facilities with 13 some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight 14 lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve 15 complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,

b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell
alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with the
commission by the Historic Sites and Preservation Division
of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln
Presidential Library and Museum, and

c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the lodge or
restaurant concessionaire only during the hours from 11
o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.

The sale of alcoholic liquors pursuant to this Section does not authorize the establishment and operation of facilities commonly called taverns, saloons, bars, cocktail lounges, and 09700SB1835ham002 -13- LRB097 10002 ASK 56366 a

the like except as a part of lodge and restaurant facilities in State parks or golf courses owned by Forest Preserve Districts with a population of less than 3,000,000 or municipalities or park districts.

5 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in the Springfield 6 Administration Building of the Department of Transportation 7 and the Illinois State Armory in Springfield; provided, that 8 the controlling government authority may consent to such sales 9 only if

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a. the request is from a not-for-profit organization;

b. such sales would not impede normal operations of thedepartments involved;

13 c. the not-for-profit organization provides dram shop 14 liability in maximum insurance coverage limits and agrees 15 to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of 16 Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm;

d. no such sale shall be made during normal workinghours of the State of Illinois; and

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e. the consent is in writing.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in recreational areas of river conservancy districts under the control of, or leased from, the river conservancy districts. Such sales are subject to reasonable local regulations as provided in Article IV; however, no such regulations may prohibit or substantially impair the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays or Holidays. 09700SB1835ham002 -14- LRB097 10002 ASK 56366 a

1 Alcoholic liquors may be provided in long term care facilities owned or operated by a county under Division 5-21 or 2 5-22 of the Counties Code, when approved by the facility 3 4 operator and not in conflict with the regulations of the 5 Illinois Department of Public Health, to residents of the 6 facility who have had their consumption of the alcoholic liquors provided approved in writing by a physician licensed to 7 practice medicine in all its branches. 8

9 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and dispensed in 10 State housing assigned to employees of the Department of 11 Corrections. No person shall furnish or allow to be furnished 12 any alcoholic liquors to any prisoner confined in any jail, 13 reformatory, prison or house of correction except upon a 14 physician's prescription for medicinal purposes.

15 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the 16 Willard Ice Building in Springfield, at the State Library in Springfield, and at Illinois State Museum facilities by (1) an 17 agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial 18 or 19 executive, provided that such agency first obtains written 20 permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the controlling government authority, or by (2) a not-for-profit 21 22 organization, provided that such organization:

a. Obtains written consent from the controllinggovernment authority;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a mannerthat does not impair normal operations of State offices

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located in the building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in
connection with an official activity in the building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram
shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in
which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and
indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of
alcoholic liquors.

10 Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit 11 organization or agency of the State from employing the services 12 of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of 13 alcoholic liquors at authorized functions.

The controlling government authority for the Willard Ice Building in Springfield shall be the Director of the Department of Revenue. The controlling government authority for Illinois State Museum facilities shall be the Director of the Illinois State Museum. The controlling government authority for the State Library in Springfield shall be the Secretary of State.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail or dispensed at any facility, property or building under the jurisdiction of the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum where the delivery, sale or dispensing is by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency 09700SB1835ham002 -16- LRB097 10002 ASK 56366 a

first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from a controlling government authority, or by (2) an individual or organization provided that such individual or organization:

5 a. Obtains written consent from the controlling 6 government authority;

that does not impair normal workings of State offices or
operations located at the facility, property or building;

10 c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in 11 connection with an official activity of the individual or 12 organization in the facility, property or building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram
shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in
which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and
indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of
alcoholic liquors.

19 The controlling government authority for the Historic 20 Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation 21 Agency shall be the Director of the Historic Sites and 22 Preservation, and the controlling government authority for the 23 Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum shall be the 24 Director of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and 25 Museum.

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Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail or

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1 dispensed for consumption at the Michael Bilandic Building at 2 160 North LaSalle Street, Chicago IL 60601, after the normal 3 business hours of any day care or child care facility located 4 in the building, by (1) a commercial tenant or subtenant 5 conducting business on the premises under a lease made pursuant 6 to Section 405-315 of the Department of Central Management Services Law (20 ILCS 405/405-315), provided that such tenant 7 or subtenant who accepts delivery of, sells, or dispenses 8 9 alcoholic liquors shall procure and maintain dram shop 10 liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the 11 carrier agrees to defend, indemnify, and save harmless the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage, or harm 12 13 arising out of the delivery, sale, or dispensing of alcoholic 14 liquors, or by (2) an agency of the State, whether legislative, 15 judicial, or executive, provided that such agency first obtains 16 written permission to accept delivery of and sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Director of Central Management 17 Services, or by (3) a not-for-profit organization, provided 18 19 that such organization:

a. obtains written consent from the Department of
Central Management Services;

22 b. accepts delivery of and sells or dispenses the 23 alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal 24 operations of State offices located in the building;

c. accepts delivery of and sells or dispenses alcoholicliquors only in connection with an official activity in the

1 building; and

d. provides, or its catering service provides, dram
shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in
which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless, and
indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
damage, or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of
alcoholic liquors.

8 Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit 9 organization or agency of the State from employing the services 10 of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of 11 alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Director of 12 Central Management Services.

13 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the 14 James R. Thompson Center in Chicago, subject to the provisions 15 of Section 7.4 of the State Property Control Act, and 222 South 16 College Street in Springfield, Illinois by (1) a commercial tenant or subtenant conducting business on the premises under a 17 lease or sublease made pursuant to Section 405-315 of the 18 Department of Central Management Services Law 19 (20 ILCS 20 405/405-315), provided that such tenant or subtenant who sells 21 or dispenses alcoholic liquors shall procure and maintain dram 22 shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in 23 which the carrier agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless 24 the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm 25 arising out of the sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquors, or 26 by (2) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or

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executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Director of Central Management Services, or by (3) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:

a. Obtains written consent from the Department of
Central Management Services;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner
that does not impair normal operations of State offices
located in the building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in
 connection with an official activity in the building;

d. Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered at any facility owned by the Illinois Sports Facilities Authority provided that dram shop liability insurance has been made available in a form, with such coverage and in such amounts as the Authority 09700SB1835ham002

1 reasonably determines is necessary.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Rockford State Office Building by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Department of Central Management Services, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:

9 a. Obtains written consent from the Department of
10 Central Management Services;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only inconnection with an official activity in the building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram
shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in
which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and
indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of
alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Department of Central Management Services. 09700SB1835ham002 -21- LRB097 10002 ASK 56366 a

1 Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in a building 2 that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county in the City of Bloomington, and used by the McLean 3 4 County Historical Society if the sale or delivery is approved 5 by an ordinance adopted by the county board, and the 6 municipality in which the building is located may not prohibit that sale or delivery, notwithstanding any other provision of 7 this Section. The regulation of the sale and delivery of 8 9 alcoholic liquor in a building that is owned by McLean County, 10 situated on land owned by the county, and used by the McLean 11 County Historical Society as provided in this paragraph is an exclusive power and function of the State and is a denial and 12 13 limitation under Article VII, Section 6, subsection (h) of the 14 Illinois Constitution of the power of a home rule municipality 15 to regulate that sale and delivery.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in any building situated on land held in trust for any school district organized under Article 34 of the School Code, if the building is not used for school purposes and if the sale or delivery is approved by the board of education.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in buildings owned by the Community Building Complex Committee of Boone County, Illinois if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance with coverage and in amounts that the Committee reasonably determines are necessary. Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in the building
 located at 1200 Centerville Avenue in Belleville, Illinois and
 occupied by either the Belleville Area Special Education
 District or the Belleville Area Special Services Cooperative.

5 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the Louis 6 Joliet Renaissance Center, City Center Campus, located at 214 7 N. Ottawa Street, Joliet, and the Food Services/Culinary Arts 8 Department facilities, Main Campus, located at 1215 Houbolt 9 Road, Joliet, owned by or under the control of Joliet Junior 10 College, Illinois Community College District No. 525.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at Triton
 College, Illinois Community College District No. 504.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the

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14 College of DuPage, Illinois Community College District No. 502.

15 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the 16 building located at 446 East Hickory Avenue in Apple River, Illinois, owned by the Apple River Fire Protection District, 17 and occupied by the Apple River Community Association if the 18 alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with 19 20 organized functions approved by the Apple River Community 21 Association for which the planned attendance is 20 or more 22 persons and if the person or facility selling or dispensing the 23 alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance in 24 maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Apple River Fire 25 Protection District, the Village of Apple River, and the Apple 26 River Community Association from all financial loss, damage,

1 and harm.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the Sikia Restaurant, Kennedy King College Campus, located at 740 West 63rd Street, Chicago, and at the Food Services in the Great Hall/Washburne Culinary Institute Department facility, Kennedy King College Campus, located at 740 West 63rd Street, Chicago, owned by or under the control of City Colleges of Chicago, Illinois Community College District No. 508.

<u>Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed on the</u>
<u>replica canal boat owned and operated by the Canal Corridor</u>
<u>Association on the I&M Canal at or near LaSalle, Illinois.</u>
