

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The amount of \$30,843,200, or so much thereof  
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
7 Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to meet its  
8 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,  
9 2013.

10 Section 10. In addition to other amounts appropriated,  
11 the amount of \$1,400,000, or so much thereof as may be  
12 necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to  
13 the Office of the Attorney General for operational expenses,  
14 awards, grants, and permanent improvements for the fiscal  
15 year ending June 30, 2013.

16 Section 15. The sum of \$1,300,000, or so much thereof as  
17 is available for use by the Attorney General, is appropriated  
18 to the Attorney General from the Illinois Gaming Law  
19 Enforcement Fund for State law enforcement purposes.

1 Section 20. The following named sums, or so much thereof  
 2 as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated from the  
 3 Asbestos Abatement Fund to the Attorney General to meet the  
 4 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Environmental  
 5 Enforcement-Asbestos Litigation Division:

17 Section 25. The amount of \$7,750,000, or so much thereof  
 18 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney  
 19 General Court Ordered and Voluntary Compliance Payment  
 20 Projects Fund to the Office of the Attorney General for use,  
 21 subject to pertinent court order or agreement, in the  
 22 performance of any function pertaining to the exercise of the  
 23 duties of the Attorney General, including State law  
 24 enforcement and public education.

1           Section 30. The amount of \$1,600,000, or so much thereof  
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois  
3 Charity Bureau Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to  
4 enforce the provisions of the Solicitation for Charity Act  
5 and to gather and disseminate information about charitable  
6 trustees and organizations to the public.

7           Section 35. The amount of \$8,700,000, or so much thereof  
8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney  
9 General Whistleblower Reward and Protection Fund to the  
10 Office of the Attorney General for ordinary and contingent  
11 expenses, including State law enforcement purposes.

12           Section 40. The amount of \$8,350,000, or so much thereof  
13 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney  
14 General's State Projects and Court Ordered Distribution Fund  
15 to the Attorney General for payment of interagency  
16 agreements, for court-ordered distributions to third parties,  
17 and, subject to pertinent court order, for performance of any  
18 function pertaining to the exercise of the duties of the  
19 Attorney General, including State law enforcement and public  
20 education.

21           Section 45. The amount of \$5,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General's  
 2 Grant Fund to the Office of the Attorney General to be  
 3 expended in accordance with the terms and conditions upon  
 4 which those funds were received.

5 Section 50. The following named amounts, or so much  
 6 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects  
 7 and purposes named in this Section, are appropriated to the  
 8 Attorney General to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses  
 9 of the Attorney General:

5           Section 60. The amount of \$2,750,000, or so much thereof  
6 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney  
7 General Federal Grant Fund to the Office of the Attorney  
8 General for funding for federal grants.

9           Section 65. The amount of \$50,000, or so much thereof as  
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Statewide Grand  
11 Jury Prosecution Fund to the Office of the Attorney General  
12 for expenses incurred in criminal prosecutions arising under  
13 the Statewide Grand Jury Act.

14           Section 70. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as  
15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the  
16 Attorney General from the Domestic Violence Fund pursuant to  
17 Public Act 95-711 for grants to public or private nonprofit  
18 agencies for the purposes of facilitating or providing free  
19 domestic violence legal advocacy, assistance, or services to  
20 victims of domestic violence who are married or formerly  
21 married or parties or former parties to a civil union related  
22 to order of protection proceedings, or other proceedings for

1 civil remedies for domestic violence.

2 Section 75. The amount of \$3,500,000, or so much thereof  
3 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney  
4 General Tobacco Fund to the Office of the Attorney General  
5 for the oversight, enforcement, and implementation of the  
6 Master Settlement Agreement entered in the case of People of  
7 the State of Illinois v. Philip Morris, et al (Circuit Court  
8 of Cook County, No. 96L13146), for the administration and  
9 enforcement of the Tobacco Product Manufacturers' Escrow Act,  
10 for the handling of tobacco-related litigation, and for other  
11 law enforcement activities of the Attorney General.

12 Section 80. The amount of \$50,000, or so much thereof as  
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Attorney General  
14 Sex Offender Awareness, Training, and Education Fund to the  
15 Office of the Attorney General to administer the I-SORT  
16 program and to alert and educate the public, victims, and  
17 witnesses of their rights under various victim notification  
18 laws and for training law enforcement agencies, State's  
19 Attorneys, and medical providers regarding their legal duties  
20 concerning the prosecution and investigation of sex offenses.

12 ARTICLE 7

13 Section 5. The amount of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof  
14 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the  
15 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of  
16 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section  
17 4 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of  
18 their respective houses throughout the year in connection  
19 with their legislative duties and responsibilities and not in  
20 connection with any political campaign as prescribed by law.  
21 Of this amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of  
22 the Senate for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated  
23 to the Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

1           Section 10.   Payments from the amounts appropriated in

3   voucher approved by the member to the State Comptroller.   The
