1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2467

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend Senate Bill 2467, by deleting  
3 everything after the enacting clause and replacing it with  
4 the following:

5 "ARTICLE 1

6 Section 5. The sum of \$597,800, or so much thereof as  
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
8 Fund to the Procurement Policy Board for its ordinary and  
9 contingent expenses.

10 ARTICLE 2

11 Section 5. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as  
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
13 Fund to the Executive Ethics Commission for its ordinary and

1 contingent expenses.

2 ARTICLE 3

3 Section 5. The amount of \$8,531,315, or so much thereof  
4 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
5 Fund to the Executive Inspector General to meet its  
6 operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012

7 ARTICLE 4

8 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much  
9 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects  
10 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated for the  
11 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Office of the  
12 Governor:

14 ARTICLE 5

15 Section 5. The amount of \$1,901,200, or so much thereof  
16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue  
17 Fund to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor to meet its  
18 operational expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
19 2011.

20 Section 10. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as  
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Agricultural

1 Premium Fund to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor for all  
 2 costs associated with the Rural Affairs Council including any  
 3 grants or administrative expenses.

4 Section 15. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as  
 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Lieutenant  
 6 Governor's Grant Fund to the Office of the Lieutenant  
 7 Governor to be expended in accordance with the terms and  
 8 conditions upon which such funds were received and in the  
 9 exercise of the powers or performance of the duties of the  
 10 Office of the Lieutenant Governor.

11 ARTICLE 6

12 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much

18 Section 20. The amount of \$113,400, or so much thereof  
 19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the School

 21 and Budget for operational expenses related to the School  
 22 Infrastructure Program.

1           Section 30.     No contract shall be entered into or  
2     obligation incurred for any expenditures from the  
3     appropriations made in Sections 10, 15, and 20 until after  
4     the purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the  
5     Governor.

6   ARTICLE 7

7           Section 5.     The amount of \$30,705,700, or so much thereof  
8     as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue

10    operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30,

12          Section 6.     In addition to other amounts appropriated,  
13    the amount of \$1,887,500, or so much thereof as may be  
14    necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to  
15    the Office of the Attorney General for operational expenses,  
16    awards, grants and permanent improvements for the fiscal year  
17    ending June 30, 2012.

18          Section 7.     The sum of \$1,300,000, or so much thereof as  
19    is available for use by the Attorney General, is appropriated  
20    to the Attorney General from the Illinois Gaming Law

1 Enforcement Fund for State law enforcement purposes.

9 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of  
10 State from the Illinois Route 66 Heritage Project Fund to  
11 provide grants for the development of tourism, education,  
12 preservation and promotion of Route 66.

13 Section 115. The sum of \$200,000, or so much of this  
14 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Police  
15 Memorial Committee Fund to the Office of the Secretary of  
16 State for grants to the Police Memorial Committee for  
17 maintaining a memorial statue, holding an annual memorial  
18 commemoration, and giving scholarships to children of police  
19 officers killed in the line of duty.

20 Section 120. The sum of \$140,000, or so much of this  
21 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the

1 Mammogram Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for  
 2 grants to the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer  
 3 research, education, screening, and treatment.

4 Section 125. The following amounts, or so much of these  
 5 amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are appropriated  
 6 to the Office of the Secretary of State for such purposes in  
 7 Section 3-646 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5), for  
 8 grants to the Regional Organ Bank of Illinois and to Mid-  
 9 America Transplant Services for the purpose of promotion of  
 10 organ and tissue donation awareness. These amounts are in  
 11 addition to any amounts otherwise appropriated to the Office  
 12 of the Secretary of State:

13 From Organ Donor Awareness Fund .....200,000

14 Section 130. The amount of \$500, or so much thereof as  
 15 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
 16 from the Chicago and Northeast Illinois District Council of  
 17 Carpenters Fund to provide grants for charitable purposes.

18 Section 135. The amount of \$70,000, or so much thereof as  
 19 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
 20 from the U.S. Marine Corps Scholarship Fund to provide grants  
 21 for scholarships for Higher Education.

1           Section 140. The amount of \$700,000, or so much of this  
2 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the SOS  
3 Federal Projects Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State  
4 for the payment of any operational expenses relating to the  
5 cost incident to augmenting the Illinois Commercial Motor  
6 Vehicle safety program by assuring and verifying the identity  
7 of drivers prior to licensure, including CDL operators; for  
8 improved security for Drivers Licenses and Personal  
9 Identification Cards; and any other related program deemed  
10 appropriate by the Office of the Secretary of State.

11           Section 145. The amount of \$2,333,500, or so much of this  
12 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
13 the Secretary of State from the Securities Investors  
14 Education Fund for any expenses used to promote public  
15 awareness of the dangers of securities fraud.

16           Section 150. The amount of \$5,000, or so much of this  
17 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
18 the Secretary of State from the Secretary of State Evidence  
19 Fund for the purchase of evidence, for the employment of  
20 persons to obtain evidence, and for the payment for any goods  
21 or services related to obtaining evidence.

22           Section 155. The amount of \$225,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Alternate Fuels  
2 Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for the cost of  
3 administering the Alternate Fuels Act.

4 Section 160. The amount of \$17,124,000, or so much of  
5 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
6 Secretary of State Special Services Fund to the Office of the  
7 Secretary of State for office automation and technology.

8 Section 165. The amount of \$15,561,600, or so much of  
9 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
10 Motor Vehicle License Plate Fund to the Office of the  
11 Secretary of State for the cost incident to providing new or  
12 replacement plates for motor vehicles.

13 Section 170. The sum of \$2,500,000, or so much of this  
14 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
15 Secretary of State DUI Administration Fund to the Office of  
16 Secretary of State for operation of the Department of  
17 Administrative Hearings of the Office of Secretary of State  
18 and for no other purpose.

19 Section 175. The amount of \$30,000, or so much thereof as  
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Secretary of State  
21 Police DUI Fund to the Secretary of State for the payments of

1 goods and services that will assist in the prevention of  
2 alcohol-related criminal violence throughout the State.

3 Section 180. The amount of \$350,000 is appropriated from  
4 the Secretary of State Police Services Fund to the Secretary  
5 of State for purposes as indicated by the grantor or  
6 contractor or, in the case of money bequeathed or granted for  
7 no specific purpose, for any purpose as deemed appropriate by  
8 the Director of Police, Secretary of State in administering  
9 the responsibilities of the Secretary of State Department of  
10 Police.

11 Section 185. The amount of \$500,000, or so much of this  
12 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Office  
13 of the Secretary of State Grant Fund to the Office of the  
14 Secretary of State to be expended in accordance with the  
15 terms and conditions upon which such funds were received.

16 Section 190. The amount of \$24,300, or so much of this  
17 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
18 the Secretary of State from the State Library Fund to  
19 increase the collection of books, records, and holdings; to  
20 hold public forums; to purchase equipment and resource  
21 materials for the State Library; and for the upkeep, repair,  
22 and maintenance of the State Library building and grounds.

1 Section 195. The following amount, or so much of this  
 2 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
 3 the Secretary of State for any operations, alterations,  
 4 rehabilitations, new construction, and maintenance of the  
 5 interior and exterior of the various buildings and facilities  
 6 under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of State to enhance  
 7 security measures in the Capitol Complex:

8 From General Revenue Fund .....3,500,000

9 Section 200. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much of  
 10 that amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
 11 Secretary of State Identification Security and Theft  
 12 Prevention Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for all  
 13 costs related to implementing identification security and  
 14 theft prevention measures.

15 Section 205 The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much of this  
 16 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the  
 17 Monitoring Device Driving Permit Administration Fee Fund to  
 18 the Office of the Secretary of State for all Secretary of  
 19 State costs associated with administering Monitoring Device  
 20 Driving Permits per Public Act 95-0400.



1           Section 210. The sum of \$500,000, or so much of this  
2 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Indigent  
3 BAIID Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State to  
4 reimburse ignition interlock device providers per Public Act  
5 95-0400.

6           Section 215. The amount of \$35,000, or so much thereof as  
7 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
8 from the Illinois Professional Golfers Association Junior  
9 Golf Fund for grants to the Illinois Professional Golfers  
10 Association Foundation to help Association members expose  
11 Illinois youngsters to the game of golf.

12          Section 220. The amount of \$60,000, or so much thereof as  
13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
14 from the Agriculture in the Classroom Fund for grants to  
15 support Agriculture in the Classroom programming for public  
16 and private schools within Illinois.

17          Section 225. The amount of \$10,000, or so much thereof as  
18 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
19 from the Boy Scout and Girl Scout Fund for grants to the  
20 Illinois divisions of the Boy Scouts of America and the Girl  
21 Scouts of the U.S.A.

1 Section 230. The amount of \$5,000, or so much thereof as  
2 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
3 from the Support Our Troops Fund for grants to Illinois  
4 Support Our Troops, Inc. for charitable assistance to the  
5 troops and their families in accordance with its Articles of  
6 Incorporation.

7 Section 235. The amount of \$5,000, or so much thereof as  
8 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
9 from the Illinois EMS Memorial Scholarship and Training Fund  
10 for grants to the EMS Memorial Scholarship and Training  
11 Council for providing scholarships for graduate study,  
12 undergraduate study, or both, to children and spouses of  
13 emergency medical services (EMS) personnel killed in the  
14 course of their employment and for grants for the training of  
15 EMS personnel.

16 Section 240. The amount of \$5,000, or so much of this  
17 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
18 the Secretary of State from the Rotary Club Fund for grants  
19 for charitable purposes sponsored by the Rotary Club.

20 Section 245. The amount of \$5,000, or so much of this  
21 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
22 the Secretary of State from the Ovarian Cancer Awareness Fund

1 for grants to the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition, Inc. for  
2 ovarian cancer research, education, screening, and treatment.

3 Section 250. The amount of \$3,000, or so much of this  
4 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
5 the Secretary of State from the Sheet Metal Workers  
6 International Association of Illinois Fund for grants for  
7 charitable purposes sponsored by Illinois chapters of the  
8 Sheet Metal Workers International Association.

9 Section 255. The amount of \$30,000, or so much of this  
10 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of  
11 the Secretary of State from the Illinois Police Association  
12 Fund for providing death benefits for the families of police  
13 officers killed in the line of duty, and for providing  
14 scholarships, for graduate study, undergraduate study, or  
15 both, to children and spouses of police officers killed in  
16 the line of duty.

17 Section 260. The amount of \$4,000, or so much thereof as  
18 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
19 from the International Brotherhood of Teamsters Fund for  
20 grants to the Teamsters Joint Council 25 Charitable Trust for  
21 religious, charitable, scientific, literary, and educational  
22 purposes.

1           Section 265. The amount of \$500, or so much thereof as  
2           may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
3           from the United Auto Workers' Fund for grants for charitable  
4           purposes sponsored by Illinois local unions affiliated with  
5           the United Auto Workers.

6           Section 270. The amount of \$5,000, or so much thereof as  
7           may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
8           from the Autism Awareness Fund for grants to the Illinois  
9           Department of Human Services for the purpose of grants for  
10          research, education, and awareness regarding autism and  
11          autism spectrum disorders.

12          Section 275. The amount of \$20,000, or so much thereof as  
13          may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State  
14          from the Share the Road Fund for grants to the League of  
15          Illinois Bicyclists, a not for profit corporation, for  
16          educational programs instructing bicyclists and motorists how  
17          to legally and more safely share the roadways.

18          Section 280. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof  
19          as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of  
20          business on June 30, 2011, from an appropriation heretofore  
21          made for such purpose in Article 106, Section 5 of Public Act

1 96-0956, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build  
 2 Illinois Bond Fund to the Secretary of State for capital  
 3 grants to public libraries for permanent improvements.

4 ARTICLE 13

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much of  
 6 those amounts as may be necessary, respectively, are  
 7 appropriated to the Auditor General from the General Revenue  
 8 Fund to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of the  
 9 Office of the Auditor General, as provided in the Illinois  
 10 State Auditing Act:
