2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by changing
Section 31-5 as follows:

6 (720 ILCS 5/31-5) (from Ch. 38, par. 31-5)

7 Sec. 31-5. Concealing or aiding a fugitive.

8 Every person not standing in the relation of husband, wife, 9 parent, child, brother or sister to the offender, who, with 10 intent to prevent the apprehension of the offender, conceals 11 his knowledge that an offense has been committed or harbors, 12 aids or conceals the offender, commits a Class 4 felony. 13 (Source: P.A. 77-2638.)
