10 (a) "Licensure" means the act of obtaining or holding a11 license issued by the Department as provided in this Act.

12 (b) "Department" means the Department of Professional13 Regulation.

14 (c) "Director" means the Director of Professional 15 Regulation.

16 (d) "Person" means any individual, partnership, 17 corporation, business trust, limited liability company, or 18 other legal entity.

(e) "Roofing contractor" is one who has the experience, knowledge and skill to construct, reconstruct, alter, maintain and repair roofs and use materials and items used in the construction, reconstruction, alteration, maintenance and repair of all kinds of roofing and waterproofing as related to SB3279 Enrolled - 2 - LRB097 17499 CEL 62702 b

roofing, all in such manner to comply with all plans, specifications, codes, laws, and regulations applicable thereto, but does not include such contractor's employees to the extent the requirements of Section 3 of this Act apply and extend to such employees.

(f) "Board" means the Roofing Advisory Board.

7 (g) "Qualifying party" means the individual filing as a 8 sole proprietor, partner of a partnership, officer of a 9 corporation, trustee of a business trust, or party of another 10 legal entity, who is legally qualified to act for the business 11 organization in all matters connected with its roofing 12 contracting business, has the authority to supervise roofing 13 installation operations, and is actively engaged in day to day 14 activities of the business organization.

15 "Qualifying party" does not apply to a seller of roofing 16 materials or services when the construction, reconstruction, 17 alteration, maintenance, or repair of roofing or waterproofing 18 is to be performed by a person other than the seller or the 19 seller's employees.

20 (h) "Limited roofing license" means a license made 21 available to contractors whose roofing business is limited to 22 residential roofing, including residential properties 23 consisting of 8 units or less.

(i) "Unlimited roofing license" means a license made
 available to contractors whose roofing business is unlimited in
 nature and includes roofing on residential, commercial, and

Display of license number; building permits; 13 advertising. 14 (a) Each State licensed roofing contractor shall affix the 15 roofing contractor license number and the licensee's name, as 16 it appears on the license, to all of his or her contracts and bids. In addition, the official issuing building permits shall 17 18 affix the roofing contractor license number to each application 19 for a building permit and on each building permit issued and 20 recorded. 21 (a-3) A municipality or a county that requires a building 22 permit may not issue a building permit to a roofing contractor 23 unless that contractor has provided sufficient proof that he or 24 she is licensed currently as a roofing contractor by the State. 25 Holders of an unlimited roofing license may be issued permits SB3279 Enrolled - 4 - LRB097 17499 CEL 62702 b

1 for residential, commercial, and industrial roofing projects.
2 Holders of a limited roofing license are restricted to permits
3 for work on residential properties consisting of 8 units or
4 less.

5 (a-5) A person who knowingly, in the course of applying for 6 a building permit with a unit of local government, provides the 7 roofing license number <u>or name</u> of a roofing contractor whom he 8 or she does not intend to have perform the work on the roofing 9 portion of the project commits identity theft under paragraph 10 (8) of subsection (a) of Section 16-30 of the Criminal Code of 11 1961.

12 (a-10) A building permit applicant must present a government-issued identification along with the building 13 14 permit application. Except for the name of the individual, all other personal information contained in the government-issued 15 16 identification shall be exempt from disclosure under 17 subsection (c) of Section 7 of the Freedom of Information Act. The official issuing the building permit shall maintain the 18 19 name and identification number, as it appears on the government-issued identification, in the building permit 20 21 application file. It is not necessary that the building permit 22 applicant be the qualifying party. This subsection shall not 23 apply to a county or municipality whose building permit process 24 occurs through electronic means.

(c) Every holder of a license shall display it in a

conspicuous place in his or her principal office, place of
 business, or place of employment.

(d) No person licensed under this Act may advertise 3 services regulated by this Act unless that person includes in 4 5 the advertisement the roofing contractor license number and the 6 licensee's name, as it appears on the license. Nothing 7 contained in this subsection requires the publisher of 8 advertising for roofing contractor services to investigate or 9 verify the accuracy of the license number provided by the 10 licensee.

11 (e) A person who advertises services regulated by this Act 12 who knowingly (i) fails to display the license number and the licensee's name, as it appears on the license, in any manner 13 14 required by this Section, (ii) fails to provide a publisher 15 with the correct license number as required by subsection (d), 16 or (iii) provides a publisher with a false license number or a 17 license number of another person, or a person who knowingly allows his or her license number to be displayed or used by 18 19 another person to circumvent any provisions of this Section, is 20 quilty of a Class A misdemeanor with a fine of \$1,000, and, in administrative enforcement 21 addition, is subject to the 22 provisions of this Act. Each day that an advertisement runs or 23 each day that a person knowingly allows his or her license to be displayed or used in violation of this Section constitutes a 24 separate offense. 25

4 Sec. 11. Application of Act.

5 (1) Nothing in this Act limits the power of a municipality, 6 city or county to regulate the quality and character of work 7 performed by roofing contractors through a system of permits, 8 fees, and inspections which are designed to secure compliance 9 with and aid in the implementation of State and local building 10 laws or to enforce other local laws for the protection of the 11 public health and safety.

12 (2) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to require a 13 seller of roofing materials or services to be licensed as a 14 roofing contractor when the construction, reconstruction, 15 alteration, maintenance or repair of roofing or waterproofing 16 is to be performed by a person other than the seller or the 17 seller's employees.

18 (3) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to require a 19 person who performs roofing or waterproofing work to his or her 20 own property, or for no consideration, to be licensed as a 21 roofing contractor.

(4) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to require a person who performs roofing or waterproofing work to his or her employer's property to be licensed as a roofing contractor, where there exists an employer-employee relationship. Nothing SB3279 Enrolled - 7 - LRB097 17499 CEL 62702 b

in this Act shall be construed to apply to the installation of plastics, glass or fiberglass to greenhouses and related horticultural structures, or to the repair or construction of farm buildings.

5 (5) Nothing in this Act limits the power of a municipality, 6 city, or county to collect occupational license and inspection 7 fees for engaging in roofing contracting.

8 Nothing in this Act limits the power of (6) the 9 municipalities, cities or counties to adopt any system of 10 permits requiring submission to and approval bv the 11 municipality, city, or county of plans and specifications for 12 work to be performed by roofing contractors before commencement 13 of the work.

14 (7) Any official authorized to issue building or other 15 related permits shall ascertain that the applicant contractor 16 is duly licensed before issuing the permit. The evidence shall 17 consist only of the exhibition to him or her of current 18 evidence of licensure.

19 (8) This Act applies to any roofing contractor performing 20 work for the State or any county or municipality. Officers of 21 the State or any county or municipality are required to 22 determine compliance with this Act before awarding any 23 contracts for construction, improvement, remodeling, or 24 repair.

(9) If an incomplete contract exists at the time of deathof a contractor, the contract may be completed by any person

even though not licensed. Such person shall notify the 1 2 Department within 30 days after the death of the contractor of 3 his or her name and address. For the purposes of this subsection, an incomplete contract is one which has been 4 5 awarded to, or entered into by, the contractor before his or 6 her death or on which he or she was the low bidder and the contract is subsequently awarded to him or her regardless of 7 8 whether any actual work has commenced under the contract before 9 his or her death.

10 (10) The State or any county or municipality may require 11 that bids submitted for roofing construction, improvement, 12 remodeling, or repair of public buildings be accompanied by 13 evidence that that bidder holds an appropriate license issued 14 pursuant to this Act.

(11) <u>(Blank).</u> A municipality that requires a building permit or a county that requires a building permit may not issue a building permit to a roofing contractor unless that contractor has provided sufficient proof that he or she is licensed currently as a roofing contractor by the State of Illinois.
