The School Code is amended by adding Sections 4 10-20.55 and 34-18.47 as follows: 5 6 (105 ILCS 5/10-20.55 new)7 Sec. 10-20.55. Prohibition on industrially produced trans 8 fat. (a) For purposes of this Section: 9 10 "Food containing industrially produced trans fat" means a food that contains vegetable shortening, margarine, or any kind 11 12 of partially hydrogenated vegetable oil, unless the 13 manufacturer's documentation or the label required on the food, pursuant to applicable federal laws and regulations, lists the 14 15 trans fat content as zero grams of trans fat per serving. "School food service establishment" means a place that 16

- regularly sells or serves a food item or meal on a school 1 2 campus.
- (b) Each school district must not make available food 3 4 containing industrially produced trans fat or use 5 containing industrially produced trans fat in the preparation of a food item served to students from any source, including, 6 but not limited to, school stores, school vending machines, 7 school cafeterias, school food service establishments, and 8
- 10 (c) Subsection (b) of this Section applies to all food and 11 beverages sold on school grounds during the regular and extended school day. The extended school day shall include 12 activities such as clubs, yearbook, band and choir practice, 13 14 student government, drama, and childcare and latchkey 15 programs.
