SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/12-610.1 625 ILCS 5/12-610.2

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that except for specified purposes, no person may use a wireless telephone while operating a motor vehicle within 500 feet of an emergency scene where an authorized emergency vehicle is present and making use of audible or visual signals. Adds digital photographs and video to the definition of "electronic message" in provisions prohibiting the use of electronic communication devices while operating a motor vehicle.

AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
 Sections 12-610.1 and 12-610.2 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.1)

7 Sec. 12-610.1. Wireless telephones.

8 (a) As used in this Section, "wireless telephone" means a 9 device that is capable of transmitting or receiving telephonic 10 communications without a wire connecting the device to the 11 telephone network.

(b) A person under the age of 19 years who holds an instruction permit issued under Section 6-105 or 6-107.1, or a person under the age of 19 years who holds a graduated license issued under Section 6-107, may not drive a vehicle on a roadway while using a wireless phone.

(c) This Section does not apply to a person under the age of 19 years using a wireless telephone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.

(d) If a graduated driver's license holder over the age of
18 committed an offense against traffic regulations governing

1 the movement of vehicles or any violation of Section 6-107 or 2 Section 12-603.1 of this Code in the 6 months prior to the graduated driver's license holder's 18th birthday, and was 3 4 subsequently convicted of the violation, the provisions of 5 paragraph (b) shall continue to apply until such time as a 6 period of 6 consecutive months has elapsed without an 7 additional violation and subsequent conviction of an offense 8 against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles 9 or any violation of Section 6-107 or Section 12-603.1 of this 10 Code.

11 (e) A person, regardless of age, may not use a wireless 12 telephone at any time while operating a motor vehicle on a 13 roadway in a school speed zone established under Section 14 11-605, or on a highway in a construction or maintenance speed 15 zone established under Section 11-605.1, or within 500 feet of 16 an emergency scene where an authorized emergency vehicle is 17 present and making use of audible or visual signals as described in Section 11-907 of this Code. This subsection (e) 18 19 does not apply to (i) a person engaged in a highway 20 construction or maintenance project for which a construction or maintenance speed zone has been established under Section 21 22 11-605.1, (ii) a person using a wireless telephone for 23 emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or 24 25 other emergency services agency or entity, (iii) а law 26 enforcement officer or operator of an emergency vehicle when

performing the officer's or operator's official duties, or (iv)
to a person using a wireless telephone in voice-activated mode,
or (v) a person using an electronic communication device for
the sole purpose of reporting an emergency scene and continued
communication with emergency personnel at the emergency scene.

(a) As used in this Section:

11 "Electronic communication device" means an electronic 12 device, including but not limited to a wireless telephone, 13 personal digital assistant, or a portable or mobile computer 14 while being used for the purpose of composing, reading, or 15 sending an electronic message, but does not include a global 16 positioning system or navigation system or a device that is physically or electronically integrated into the 17 motor vehicle. 18

19 "Electronic message" means a self-contained piece of 20 digital communication that is designed or intended to be 21 transmitted between physical devices. "Electronic message" 22 includes, but is not limited to electronic mail, a text 23 message, an instant message, <u>a digital photograph, a video,</u> or 24 a command or request to access an Internet site.

25 (b) A person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway

- while using an electronic communication device to compose,
 send, or read an electronic message.

(c) A violation of this Section is an offense against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles.

5

(d) This Section does not apply to:

6 (1) a law enforcement officer or operator of an 7 emergency vehicle while performing his or her official 8 duties;

9 (2) a driver using an electronic communication device 10 for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation 11 and continued communication with emergency personnel 12 during the emergency situation;

13 (3) a driver using an electronic communication device
14 in hands-free or voice-activated mode;

15 (4) a driver of a commercial motor vehicle reading a 16 message displayed on a permanently installed communication 17 device designed for a commercial motor vehicle with a 18 screen that does not exceed 10 inches tall by 10 inches 19 wide in size;

20 (5) a driver using an electronic communication device
21 while parked on the shoulder of a roadway; or

(6) a driver using an electronic communication device
when the vehicle is stopped due to normal traffic being
obstructed and the driver has the motor vehicle
transmission in neutral or park.
