The sum of \$125,000, or so much thereof as 11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground 12 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois 13 Commerce Commission for a grant to the Statewide One-call Notice System, as required in the Illinois Underground 14 15 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Act.

16 Section 15. The sum of \$1,000, or so much thereof as may 17 be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois Commerce 18 19 Commission for refunds.

20 Section 20. The sum of \$76,000,000, or so much thereof 21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless as 22 Service Emergency Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission 1 for its administrative costs and for grants to emergency telephone system boards, qualified government entities, or 2 3 the Department of State Police for the design, 4 implementation, operation, maintenance, or upgrade of wireless 9-1-1 or E9-1-1 emergency services and public safety 5 6 answering points.

7 Section 25. The sum of \$7,300,000, or so much thereof as 8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless Carrier 9 Reimbursement Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for 10 reimbursement of wireless carriers for costs incurred in complying with the applicable provisions 11 of Federal 12 Communications Commission wireless enhanced 9-1-1 services 13 mandates and for administrative costs incurred by the Illinois Commerce Commission related to administering the 14 15 program.

The sum of \$4,450,700, or so much thereof as 14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation 15 Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for (1) 16 disbursing funds collected for the Single State Insurance 17 Registration Program and/or Unified Carrier Registration 18 System; (2) for refunds for overpayments; and (3) for 19 administrative expenses.
