## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Notice By Publication Act. Provides that whenever a governmental unit is required to provide notice by publication in a newspaper by law, order of court, or contract, the governmental unit may publish the notice on an official government website instead of in a newspaper. Provides conditions concerning the availability and format of the notice webpage. Repeals a Section concerning the placement of published notices on a statewide website and makes corresponding changes throughout the Act and in the Newspaper Legal Notice Act. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Notice By Publication Act is amended by 5 changing Sections 3.1 and 5 and by adding Section 2.2 as 6 follows:

- 8 <u>Sec. 2.2. Electronic publication.</u>

9 <u>(a) Whenever a governmental unit is required to provide</u> 10 <u>notice by publication in a newspaper by law, order of court, or</u> 11 <u>contract, the governmental unit may publish the notice on an</u> 12 <u>official government website instead of in a newspaper.</u>

13 (b) The governmental unit, or the host of the notice 14 website, shall enter into a service-level agreement with an 15 Internet service provider that guarantees the site is 16 accessible to the public over the Internet at least 98% of the 17 time, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

18 (c) The governmental unit's official Internet website 19 shall prominently display a link to the notice web page, which 20 shall be an index web page, containing a list of all current 21 legal notices of the unit, with links to the full text of those 22 notices. 2 <u>(d) Whenever an individual is unable to access an</u> 3 <u>electronic publication of a legal notice, the issuing</u> 4 <u>governmental unit shall provide a copy of the notice to the</u> 5 <u>individual free of charge.</u>

6 <u>(e) Notices shall remain available on the website at least</u> 7 <u>until the last posting date required by law has expired or</u> 8 <u>until the event described in a notice has taken place,</u> 9 <u>whichever is later.</u>

11 Sec. 3.1. When any notice is required by law, or order of 12 court, to be published in any newspaper, publication of such notice shall include the printing of such notice in the total 13 circulation of each edition on the date of publication of the 14 15 newspaper in which the notice is published; and the newspaper 16 publishing the notice shall, at no additional cost to government, place the notice on the statewide website 17 18 established and maintained as a joint venture of the majority 19 of Illinois newspapers as a repository for such notices. All 20 notices required for publication by this Act shall remain legal 21 and valid for all purposes when any error that occurs pursuant 22 to the requirements of this Section for placement of the notice on the statewide website is the fault of the printer. 23

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(715 ILCS 5/5) (from Ch. 100, par. 5)

2 Sec. 5. When any notice is required by law or contract to 3 published in a newspaper (unless otherwise expressly be provided in the contract), it shall be intended to be in a 4 5 secular newspaper of general circulation, published in the 6 city, town or county, or some newspaper specially authorized by law to publish legal notices, in the city, town, or county. If 7 8 there is no newspaper published in the county in which the city 9 or town is located, notice shall be given in a secular 10 newspaper, as defined in this Act, that is published in an 11 adjoining county having general circulation within the city or 12 town. Unless otherwise expressly provided in the contract, the term "newspaper" means a newspaper 13

(a) which consists of not less than 4 pages of printed 14 matter and contains at least 100 square inches of printed 15 16 matter per page; and

17 (b) which is printed through the use of one of the conventional and generally recognized printing processes such 18 19 as letterpress, lithography or gravure; and

20 (c) which annually averages at least 25% news content per issue; or which annually averages at least 1,000 column inches 21 22 of news content per issue, the term "news content" meaning for the purposes of this Act any printed matter other than 23 24 advertising; and

25 (d) which publishes miscellaneous reading matter, legal or other announcements and notices, and news and information 26

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1 concerning current happenings and passing events of a 2 political, social, religious, commercial, financial or legal 3 nature, and advertisements or bulletins; and

(e) which has been continuously published at regular 4 5 intervals of at least once each week with a minimum of 50 issues per year, for at least one year prior to the first 6 7 publication of the notice; or which is a successor to a 8 newspaper as herein defined with no interruption of publication 9 of more than 30 days; or which is a merged or consolidated 10 newspaper formed by the merger or consolidation of two or more 11 newspapers, one of which has been continuously published at 12 regular intervals of at least once each week with a minimum of 13 50 issues per year, for at least one year prior to the first 14 publication of the notice. A newspaper shall be considered as 15 continuously or regularly published although its publication 16 has been suspended, where such suspension was caused by fire or 17 an Act of God or by a labor dispute or by its owner, publisher, managing editor or other essential employee entering the active 18 military service of the United States, if the newspaper was 19 20 continuously or regularly published for at least one year prior to its suspension and if its publication is resumed at any time 21 22 not later than 12 months after such fire or Act of God, or if 23 its publication is resumed at any time within 12 months after the termination of the labor dispute, or if its publication is 24 25 resumed at any time within 12 months after the termination of 26 the war in connection with which such persons entered such

The Notice By Publication Act is amended by repealing Section 2.1. Section 15. The Newspaper Legal Notice Act is amended by changing Sections 1 and 2 as follows: (715 ILCS 10/1) (from Ch. 100, par. 10) Sec. 1. Whenever it is required by law that any legal notice or publication shall be published in a newspaper in this State, it shall be held to mean a newspaper (a) which consists of not less than 4 pages of printed matter and contains at least 100 square inches of printed matter per page; and (b) which is printed through the use of one of the 18 19 conventional and generally recognized printing processes such 20 as letterpress, lithography or gravure; and (c) which annually averages at least 25% news content per 21 22 issue; or which annually averages at least 1,000 column inches of news content per issue, the term "news content" meaning for 23

1 the purposes of this Act any printed matter other than 2 advertising; and

3 (d) which publishes miscellaneous reading matter, legal or 4 other announcements and notices, and news and information 5 concerning current happenings and passing events of a 6 political, social, religious, commercial, financial or legal 7 nature, and advertisements or bulletins; and

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1 its publication is resumed at any time within 12 months after 2 the termination of the labor dispute, or if its publication is 3 resumed at any time within 12 months after the termination of 4 the war in connection with which such persons entered such 5 military service.; and

6 (f) <u>(Blank)</u>. which has the capability of placing, at no 7 additional cost to government, notices required pursuant to 8 this Act on a daily or weekly basis on the statewide website 9 established and maintained as a joint venture by the majority 10 of Illinois newspapers as a repository for such notices.

Sec. 2. When any legal notice is required by law to be 13 published in any newspaper, such notice shall include the 14 15 printing of such notice in the total circulation of each 16 edition on the date of publication of the newspaper in which the notice is published; and the newspaper publishing the 17 18 notice shall, at no additional cost to government, place the notice on the statewide website established and maintained as a 19 joint venture of the majority of Illinois newspapers as a 20 21 repository for such notices. All notices required for publication by this Act shall remain legal and valid for 22  $\frac{1}{2}$ purposes when any error that occurs pursuant to the 23 24 requirements of this Section in the requirement for placement 25 of the notice on the statewide website is the fault of the HB1260
