2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 1741 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The Motor Fuel Sales Act is amended by changing Section 2 as follows:
6	(815 ILCS 365/2) (from Ch. 121 1/2, par. 1502)
7	(Text of Section before amendment by P.A. 97-1152)
8	Sec. 2. Assistance at stations with self-service and
9	full-service islands.
10	(a) Any attendant on duty at a gasoline station or service
11	station offering to the public retail sales of motor fuel at
12	both self-service and full-service islands shall, upon
13	request, dispense motor fuel for the driver of a car which is
14	parked at a self-service island and displays: (1) registration
15	plates issued to a physically disabled person pursuant to
16	Section 3-616 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; (2) registration

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plates issued to a disabled veteran pursuant to Section 3-609 or 3-609.01 of such Code; or (3) a special decal or device issued pursuant to Section 11-1301.2 of such Code; and shall only charge such driver prices as offered to the general public for motor fuel dispensed at the self-service island. However, such attendant shall not be required to perform other services which are offered at the full-service island.

8 (b) Gasoline stations and service stations in this State 9 are subject to the federal Americans with Disabilities Act and 10 must:

(1) provide refueling assistance upon the request of an individual with a disability (A gasoline station or service station is not required to provide such service at any time that it is operating on a remote control basis with a single employee, but is encouraged to do so, if feasible.);

16 (2) let patrons know, through appropriate signs, that 17 customers with disabilities can obtain refueling 18 assistance by either honking or otherwise signaling an 19 employee; and

20 (3) provide the refueling assistance without any21 charge beyond the self-serve price.

(c) The signage required under paragraph (2) of subsection
(b) shall be designated by the station owner and shall be
posted in a prominently visible place. The sign shall be
clearly visible to customers.

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(d) The Secretary of State shall provide to persons with

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1 disabilities information regarding the availability of 2 refueling assistance under this Section by the following 3 methods:

4 (1) by posting information about that availability on
5 the Secretary of State's Internet website, along with a
6 link to the Department of Human Services website; and

7 (2) by publishing a brochure containing information
8 about that availability, which shall be made available at
9 all Secretary of State offices throughout the State.

10 (e) The Department of Human Services shall post on its 11 Internet website information regarding the availability of 12 refueling assistance for persons with disabilities and the 13 addresses and telephone numbers of all gasoline and service 14 stations in Illinois.

(f) A person commits a Class C misdemeanor if he or she telephones a gasoline station or service station to request refueling assistance and he or she:

18 (1) is not actually physically present at the gasoline19 or service station; or

20 (2) is physically present at the gasoline or service
21 station but does not actually require refueling
22 assistance.

Sec. 2. Assistance at stations with self-service and
full-service islands.

9 (a) Any attendant on duty at a gasoline station or service 10 station offering to the public retail sales of motor fuel at both self-service and full-service 11 islands shall, upon 12 request, dispense motor fuel for the driver of a car which is 13 parked at a self-service island and displays: (1) registration 14 plates issued to a physically disabled person pursuant to 15 Section 3-616 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; (2) registration plates issued to a disabled veteran pursuant to Section 3-609 16 17 or 3-609.01 of such Code; or (3) a special decal or device 18 issued pursuant to Section 11-1301.2 of such Code; and shall 19 only charge such driver prices as offered to the general public 20 for motor fuel dispensed at the self-service island. However, 21 such attendant shall not be required to perform other services which are offered at the full-service island. 22

(b) Gasoline stations and service stations in this State are subject to the federal Americans with Disabilities Act and must: 1 (1) provide refueling assistance upon the request of an 2 individual with a disability (A gasoline station or service 3 station is not required to provide such service at any time 4 that it is operating on a remote control basis with a 5 single employee on duty at the motor fuel site, but is 6 encouraged to do so, if feasible.);

(2) by January 1, 2014, provide and display at least 7 8 one ADA compliant motor fuel dispenser with a direct 9 telephone number to the station that allows a disabled 10 motor vehicle to request refueling operator of а 11 assistance, with the telephone number posted in close proximity to the International Symbol of Accessibility 12 13 required by the federal Americans with Disabilities Act, 14 however, if the station does not have at least one ADA 15 compliant motor fuel dispenser, the station must display on 16 at least one motor fuel dispenser a direct telephone number to the station that allows a disabled operator of a motor 17 vehicle to request refueling assistance; and 18

19 (2.5) by January 1, 2016, display on each motor fuel 20 dispenser a direct telephone number to the station that 21 allows a disabled operator of a motor vehicle to request 22 refueling assistance; and

(3) provide the refueling assistance without any
 charge beyond the self-serve price.

(c) The signage required under paragraph (2) of subsection(b) shall be designated by the station owner and shall be

1 posted in a prominently visible place. The sign shall be 2 clearly visible to customers.

3 (d) The Secretary of State shall provide to persons with 4 disabilities information regarding the availability of 5 refueling assistance under this Section by the following 6 methods:

7 (1) by posting information about that availability on
8 the Secretary of State's Internet website, along with a
9 link to the Department of Human Services website; and

10 (2) by publishing a brochure containing information

26 (g) The Department of Transportation shall work in

1 cooperation with appropriate representatives of gasoline and 2 service station trade associations and the petroleum industry 3 to increase the signage at gasoline and service stations on 4 interstate highways in this State with regard to the 5 availability of refueling assistance for persons with 6 disabilities.

7 (h) If an owner of a gas station or service station is 8 found by the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Bureau of 9 Weights and Measures, to be in violation of this Act, the owner 10 shall pay an administrative fine of \$250. Any moneys collected 11 by the Department shall be deposited into the Motor Fuel and Petroleum Standards Fund. The Department of Agriculture shall 12 13 have the same authority and powers as provided for in the Motor Fuel and Petroleum Standards Act in enforcing this Act. 14
