2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 12-610.1 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/12-610.1)

7 Sec. 12-610.1. Wireless telephones.

8 (a) As used in this Section, "wireless telephone" means a 9 device that is capable of transmitting or receiving telephonic 10 communications without a wire connecting the device to the 11 telephone network.

(b) A person under the age of 19 years who holds an instruction permit issued under Section 6-105 or 6-107.1, or a person under the age of 19 years who holds a graduated license issued under Section 6-107, may not drive a vehicle on a roadway while using a wireless phone.

(c) This Section does not apply to a person under the age of 19 years using a wireless telephone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.

(d) If a graduated driver's license holder over the age of18 committed an offense against traffic regulations governing

the movement of vehicles or any violation of Section 6-107 or 1 2 Section 12-603.1 of this Code in the 6 months prior to the graduated driver's license holder's 18th birthday, and was 3 subsequently convicted of the violation, the provisions of 4 5 paragraph (b) shall continue to apply until such time as a 6 period of 6 consecutive months has elapsed without an additional violation and subsequent conviction of an offense 7 8 against traffic regulations governing the movement of vehicles 9 or any violation of Section 6-107 or Section 12-603.1 of this 10 Code.

11 (e) A person, regardless of age, may not use a wireless 12 telephone at any time while operating a motor vehicle on a 13 roadway in a school speed zone established under Section 14 11-605, on a highway in a construction or maintenance speed zone established under Section 11-605.1, or within 500 feet of 15 an emergency scene. As used in this Section, "emergency scene" 16 17 means a location where an authorized emergency vehicle as defined by Section 1-105 of this Code is present and has 18 19 activated its oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights. This 20 subsection (e) does not apply to (i) a person engaged in a highway construction or maintenance project for which a 21 22 construction or maintenance speed zone has been established 23 under Section 11-605.1, (ii) a person using a wireless telephone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited 24 25 to, law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire 26 department, or other emergency services agency or entity, (iii)

a law enforcement officer or operator of an emergency vehicle 1 2 when performing the officer's or operator's official duties, (iv) a person using a wireless telephone in voice-operated 3 4 mode, which may include the use of a headset, (v) use of a 5 wireless telephone or other device that is electronically or 6 physically integrated into the motor vehicle that allows for 7 voice communication without the use of either hand except to activate or deactivate a function or feature, or (vi) (v) to a 8 9 person using a wireless telephone by pressing a single button 10 to initiate or terminate a voice communication., or (v) a 11 person using an electronic communication device for the sole 12 purpose of reporting an emergency situation and continued 13 communication with emergency personnel during the emergency 14 situation.
