SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27-6

from Ch. 122, par. 27-6

Amends the School Code. Provides that, if requested, a school board is authorized to excuse a pupil from engaging in a physical education course if the pupil is a child with a disability, is participating in an athletic program outside of the school setting that is equivalent to a varsity athletic program at his or her school, and documents such participation in a manner determined by the school board. Effective July 1, 2013.

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AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
27-6 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/27-6) (from Ch. 122, par. 27-6)

Sec. 27-6. Courses in physical education required; special
activities.

9 (a) Pupils enrolled in the public schools and State universities engaged in preparing teachers shall be required to 10 engage daily during the school day, except on block scheduled 11 days for those public schools engaged in block scheduling, in 12 courses of physical education for such periods as are 13 14 compatible with the optimum growth and developmental needs of individuals at the various age levels except when appropriate 15 16 excuses are submitted to the school by a pupil's parent or 17 guardian or by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987 and except as provided in subsection (b) of this 18 19 Section.

20 Special activities in physical education shall be provided 21 for pupils whose physical or emotional condition, as determined 22 by a person licensed under the Medical Practice Act of 1987, 23 prevents their participation in the courses provided for normal HB3053

2 (b) A school board is authorized to excuse pupils enrolled in grades 11 and 12 from engaging in physical education courses 3 if those pupils request to be excused for any of the following 4 5 reasons: (1) for ongoing participation in an interscholastic 6 athletic program; (2) to enroll in academic classes which are 7 required for admission to an institution of higher learning, provided that failure to take such classes will result in the 8 pupil being denied admission to the institution of his or her 9 10 choice; or (3) to enroll in academic classes which are required 11 for graduation from high school, provided that failure to take 12 such classes will result in the pupil being unable to graduate. 13 A school board may also excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 enrolled in a marching band program for credit from engaging in 14 15 physical education courses if those pupils request to be 16 excused for ongoing participation in such marching band 17 program. In addition, a pupil in any of grades 3 through 12 who is eligible for special education may be excused if the pupil's 18 parent or guardian agrees that the pupil must utilize the time 19 20 set aside for physical education to receive special education support and services or, if there is no agreement, the 21 22 individualized education program team for the pupil determines 23 that the pupil must utilize the time set aside for physical education to receive special education support and services, 24 which agreement or determination must be made a part of the 25 26 individualized education program. However, a pupil requiring

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adapted physical education must receive that service in 1 2 accordance with the individualized education program developed 3 for the pupil. If requested, a school board is authorized to excuse a pupil from engaging in a physical education course if 4 5 the pupil is a child with a disability as defined in Article 14 of this Code, is participating in an athletic program outside 6 7 of the school setting that is equivalent to a varsity athletic program at his or her school, and documents such participation 8 9 in a manner determined by the school board. A school board may 10 also excuse pupils in grades 9 through 12 enrolled in a Reserve 11 Officer's Training Corps (ROTC) program sponsored by the school 12 district from engaging in physical education courses. School 13 boards which choose to exercise this authority shall establish a policy to excuse pupils on an individual basis. 14

15 (c) The provisions of this Section are subject to the 16 provisions of Section 27-22.05.
