Before any person 16 years of age or older shall trap, attempt to trap, or sell the green hides of any mammal of the species defined as fur-bearing mammals by Section 2.2 for which an open season is established under this Act, he shall first have procured a State Habitat Stamp.

8 Before a trapping license shall be issued to any person 9 under the age of sixteen years, such person shall obtain the 10 written consent of his father, mother or legally constituted 11 guardian to obtain such license.

Beginning January 1, 2015 1985, no trapping license shall 12 13 be issued to any person born on or after January 1, 2015 or who 14 has not previously held a valid trapping license issued by this 15 State or another state within the 3 years immediately preceding 16 the application under 18 years of age unless he or she presents 17 to the <u>authorized issuer of the</u> person authorized to issue such license either evidence that he or she has held a trapping 18 license issued by the State of Illinois or another state in a 19 20 <del>prior year, or</del> a certificate of competency provided for in this Section. 21

The Department of Natural Resources shall authorize personnel of the Department, or volunteer instructors, found by the Department to be competent, to provide instruction in courses on trapping techniques and ethical trapping behavior as needed throughout the State, which courses shall be at least 8 09800HB5079ham001 -3- LRB098 16290 MLW 58289 a

1 hours length. Persons authorized shall provide in SO 2 instruction in such courses to individuals at no charge, and shall issue to individuals successfully completing such 3 4 courses certificates of competency in basic trapping 5 techniques. The Department shall cooperate in establishing 6 such courses with any reputable association or organization which has as one of its objectives the promotion of the ethical 7 8 use of legal fur harvesting devices and techniques. The 9 Department shall furnish information on the requirements of the 10 trapper education program to be distributed free of charge to 11 applicants for trapping licenses by the persons appointed and 12 authorized to issue licenses.

The owners residing on, or bona fide tenants of farm lands, and their children actually residing on such lands, shall have the right to trap mammals protected by this Act, for which an open trapping season has been established, upon such lands, without procuring licenses, provided that such mammals are taken during the periods of time and with such devices as are permitted by this Act.
