

## 98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2013 and 2014 HB5885

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Formaldehyde Banned in Children's Products Act. Provides that no manufacturer, wholesaler, or retailer may sell or offer for sale in this State a children's product that intentionally contains (1) formaldehyde, including formaldehyde contained in a solution, or (2) ingredients that chemically degrade under normal conditions of temperature and pressure to release formaldehyde. Provides that a manufacturer shall not replace a chemical whose use is prohibited by the Act with a chemical known to the manufacturer to have been identified on the basis of credible scientific evidence by a state, federal, or international agency as being known or suspected with a high degree of probability to cause certain harm.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Formaldehyde Banned in Children's Products Act.
- 6 Section 5. Definitions. In this Act:
- 7 "Child" means a person under 8 years of age.
  - "Children's product" means a product primarily designed or intended by a manufacturer to be physically applied to or introduced into a child's body, including any article used as a component of such a product and excluding a food, beverage, dietary supplement, pharmaceutical or biological product, a children's toy that is covered by the ASTM International F963 standard for Toy Safety, or a medical device as defined in the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, United States Code, Title 21, Section 321(h), as amended through February 15, 2013.
  - Section 10. Formaldehyde in children's products; ban. No manufacturer, wholesaler, or retailer may sell or offer for sale in this State a children's product that intentionally contains:
- 22 (1) formaldehyde, including formaldehyde contained in

- 1 a solution; or
- 2 (2) ingredients that chemically degrade under normal
- 3 conditions of temperature and pressure to release
- 4 formaldehyde.
- 5 Section 15. Formaldehyde replacement chemicals.
- 6 (a) A manufacturer shall not replace a chemical whose use
- 7 is prohibited in Section 10 of this Act with a chemical known
- 8 to the manufacturer to have been identified on the basis of
- 9 credible scientific evidence by a state, federal, or
- 10 international agency as being known or suspected with a high
- 11 degree of probability to:
- 12 (1) harm the normal development of a fetus or child or
- cause other developmental toxicity;
- 14 (2) cause cancer, genetic damage, or reproductive
- 15 harm;
- 16 (3) disrupt the endocrine or hormone system; or
- 17 (4) damage the nervous system, immune system, or organs
- or cause other systemic toxicity.
- 19 (b) For the purposes of this Section, "international
- agency" does not include an agency affiliated with a country on
- 21 the U.S. Department of State list of state sponsors of
- 22 terrorism or the U.S. Department of Treasury list of countries
- 23 with trade restrictions or sanctions.
