

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
7 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated from the
8 General Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education to meet
9 ordinary and contingent expenses for the fiscal year ending
10 June 30, 2015:

12	For State Contributions to Social

14	For Contractual Services	425,000

1 Section 10. The sum of \$434,000, or so much thereof as
 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 3 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for costs and expenses
 4 associated with the administration and enforcement associated
 5 with the P-20 Longitudinal Education Data System Act.

6 Section 15. The sum of \$208,400, or so much thereof as
 7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
 8 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for costs associated
 9 with the u.Select System.

10 Section 20. The following named amount, or so much
 11 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
 12 Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education for
 13 distribution as grants authorized by the Higher Education
 14 Cooperation Act:

16 Section 25. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 17 as may be necessary, are appropriated from the General
 18 Revenue Fund to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for
 19 Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (S.T.E.M.)
 20 diversity initiatives to enhance S.T.E.M. programs for
 21 students from underrepresented groups:

7 Section 30. The sum of \$1,114,500, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
9 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for distribution as
10 grants for Cooperative Work Study Programs to institutions of
11 higher education.

12 Section 35. The sum of \$1,200,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
14 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for a grant to the
15 Board of Trustees of the University Center of Lake County for
16 the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Center.

17 Section 40. The sum of \$1,490,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
19 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for the administration
20 and distribution of grants authorized by the Diversifying
21 Higher Education Faculty in Illinois Program.

1 Section 45. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
3 Fund to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for the Grow
4 Your Own Teachers Program.

5 Section 50. The sum of \$425,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
7 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for competitive grants
8 for nursing schools to increase the number of graduating
9 nurses.

10 Section 55. The sum of \$224,300, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
12 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for nurse educator
13 fellowships to supplement nurse faculty salaries.

14 Section 60. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
16 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for the Washington
17 Center Intern Program.

18 Section 65. The amount of \$400,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Academic Quality
20 Assurance Fund to the Board of Higher Education as
21 supplemental support for costs and expenses associated with

1 the administration and enforcement of 110 ILCS 1010.

2 Section 70. The amount of \$80,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Private College
4 Academic Quality Assurance Fund to the Board of Higher
5 Education as supplemental support for costs and expenses
6 associated with the administration and enforcement of 110
7 ILCS 1005.

8 Section 75. The amount of \$550,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Private Business
10 and Vocational Schools Quality Assurance Fund to the Board of
11 Higher Education as supplemental support for costs and
12 expenses associated with the administration and enforcement
13 of the Private Business and Vocational Schools Act of 2012.

14 Section 80. The sum of \$5,500,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the BHE Federal Grants
16 Fund to the Board of Higher Education to be expended under
17 the terms and conditions associated with the federal
18 contracts and grants moneys received.

19 Section 85. The following named amounts, or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
21 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated from the

1 Education Assistance Fund to the Illinois Mathematics and
 2 Science Academy to meet ordinary and contingent expenses for
 3 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015:
