SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the General Assembly for fiscal year 2015. Effective July 1, 2014.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The sum of \$13,091,050, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
6 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
7 Representatives for furnishing the items provided in Section
8 4 of the General Assembly Compensation Act to members of
9 their respective houses throughout the year in connection
10 with their legislative duties and responsibilities and not in
11 connection with any political campaign as prescribed by law.
12 Of this amount, 37.436% is appropriated to the President of
13 the Senate for such expenditures and 62.564% is appropriated
14 to the Speaker of the House for such expenditures.

15 Section 10. Payments from the sums appropriated in
16 Section 5 hereof shall be made only upon the delivery of a
17 voucher approved by the member to the State Comptroller. The
18 voucher shall also be approved by the President of the Senate
19 or the Speaker of the House of Representatives as the case
20 may be.

21 Section 15. The sum of \$20,603,400, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to meet
2 the ordinary and incidental expenses of the Senate
3 legislative leadership and legislative staff assistants and
4 the House Majority and Minority leadership staff, general
5 staff and office operations. Of this amount, 25.7% is
6 appropriated to the President of the Senate for such
7 expenditures, 25.7% is appropriated to the Senate Minority
8 Leader for such expenditures and 24.8% is appropriated to the
9 Speaker of the House for such expenditures, and 23.8% is
10 appropriated to the House Minority Leader for such
11 expenditures.

12 Section 20. The sum of \$9,882,100, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
14 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
15 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses of
16 committees, the general staff and operations, per diem
17 employees, special and standing committees, expenses incurred
18 in transcribing and printing of debates. Of this amount,
19 43.018% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for
20 such expenditures and 56.982% is appropriated to the Speaker
21 of the House for such expenditures.

22 Section 25. The sum of \$309,200, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the

1 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
2 Representatives for the ordinary and incidental expenses,
3 also including the purchasing on contract as required by law
4 of printing, binding, printing paper, stationery and office
5 supplies. For the House, no part of which shall be expended
6 for expenses of purchasing, handling or distributing such
7 supplies and against which no indebtedness shall be incurred
8 without the written approval of the Speaker of the House of
9 Representatives. Of this amount, 69.277% is appropriated to
10 the President of the Senate for such expenditures and 30.723%
11 is appropriated to the Speaker of the House for such
12 expenditures.

13 Section 30. The sum of \$6,483,050, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
15 President of the Senate for the use of standing committees
16 for expert witnesses, technical services, consulting
17 assistance and other research assistance associated with
18 special studies and long range research projects which may be
19 requested by the standing committees and the Speaker of the
20 House of Representatives for Standing House Committees
21 pursuant to the Legislative Commission Reorganization Act of
22 1984. Of this amount, 46.862% is appropriated to the
23 President of the Senate for such expenditures and 53.138% is
24 appropriated to the Speaker of the House for such

1 expenditures.

2 Section 35. The sum of \$167,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
4 President of the Senate and the Senate Minority Leader for
5 allowances for the particular and additional services
6 appertaining to or entailed by the respective officers of the
7 Senate. Of this amount, 50% is appropriated to the President
8 of the Senate for such expenditures and 50% is appropriated
9 to the Senate Minority Leader for such expenditures.

10 Section 40. The sum of \$88,100, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated to the
12 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
13 Representatives for travel, including expenses to Springfield
14 of members on official legislative business during weeks when
15 the General Assembly is not in Session. Of this amount,
16 65.5% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for such
17 expenditures and 34.5% is appropriated to the Speaker of the
18 House for such expenditures.

19 Section 45. The sum of \$341,600, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
21 Fund to the General Assembly to meet ordinary and contingent
22 expenses. Any use of funds appropriated under this Section

1 must be approved jointly by the Clerk of the House of
2 Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate.

3 Section 50. As used in Section 15 hereof, except where
4 the approval of the Speaker of the House of Representatives
5 is expressively required for the expenditure of or the
6 incurring of indebtedness against an appropriation for
7 certain purchases on contract, "Speaker" means the leader of
8 the party having the largest number of members of the House
9 of Representatives as of January 9, 2015, and "Minority
10 Leader" means the leader of the party having the second
11 largest number of members of the House of Representatives as
12 of January 9, 2015.

13 Section 55. The sum of \$312,500, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Legislative Ethics
15 Commission to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of
16 the Commission and the Office of Legislative Inspector
17 General.

18 Section 60. The sum of \$113,700, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated for the ordinary and
20 contingent expenses of the Senate Operations Commission
21 including the planning costs, construction costs, moving
22 expenses and all other costs associated with the construction

1 and reconstruction of Senate offices in the Capitol Complex
2 area.

3 Section 65. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, respectively, is appropriated from the
5 General Assembly Operations Revolving Fund to the President
6 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives
7 to meet ordinary and contingent expenses. Of this amount,
8 50% is appropriated to the President of the Senate for such
9 expenditures and 50% is appropriated to the Speaker of the
10 House for such expenditures.

11 Section 70. The following named sums, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary and remain unexpended from an
13 appropriation hereto made for such purposes in Section 75 of
14 Article 21 of Public Act 98-0064, as amended, are re-
15 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund for expenses in
16 connection with the planning and preparation of redistricting
17 of Legislative and Representative Districts as required by
18 Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970:

19	To the Senate President	500,000
20	To the Senate Minority Leader	<u>500,000</u>
21	Total	\$1,000,000

22 Section 75. The following named sums, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary and remain unexpended from an
 2 appropriation hereto made for such purposes in Section 80 of
 3 Article 21 of Public Act 98-0064, as amended, are re-
 4 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund for expenses in
 5 connection with the planning and preparation of redistricting
 6 of Legislative and Representative Districts as required by
 7 Article IV, Section 3 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970:

8	To the House Speaker	500,000
9	To the House Minority Leader	<u>500,000</u>
10	Total	\$1,000,000

11 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
 12 2014.
