HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The State of Illinois seeks to support development 3 that enhances agriculture, industry, public safety, and the 4 overall economy of Illinois; and

5 WHEREAS, Levees protect against reoccurring flood damage 6 and have the ability to block wide floodplains and displace 7 floodwater; and

8 WHEREAS, Permitting processes should be straightforward 9 and timely so that lawful and responsible economic growth can 10 be feasibly accomplished while preserving the goal of this 11 State to protect the people of Illinois from unmitigated flood 12 damages caused by others; and

13 WHEREAS, State regulatory processes should consider the 14 regulatory processes of federal agencies, especially the U.S. 15 Army Corps of Engineers and the federal Emergency Management 16 Agency, to minimize the burden of meeting conflicting technical 17 requirements between agencies; therefore, be it

18 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 19 NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE 20 SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we urge the Illinois Department 21 of Natural Resources to develop amendments to Part 3700 of HJ0095 -2-LRB098 20974 MGM 58632 r Title 17 of the Illinois Administrative Code for consideration of the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules that:

(1) better define the flood risk associated with levee 3 construction by adjusting the upper regulatory limit for a 4 5 worst-case analysis to be the flood discharge with a 0.2% annual chance of exceedance (500-year frequency) for 6 7 levees and floodwalls;

(2) create uniform technical policies, when applicable 8 9 and appropriate, with those imposed by other regulatory 10 agencies at the federal, State, and local levels; and

11 (3) create standards for responding to application 12 submissions in a timely manner with identification of 13 requirements for necessary submissions to demonstrate compliance with administrative rules; and be it further 14

15 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be 16 delivered to the Director of Natural Resources.
