1 HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The United States has the highest incarceration rate of any country in the world; and

- WHEREAS, With over 2,300,000 men and women living behind bars, our imprisonment rate is the highest it has ever been in United States history; and
- WHEREAS, Despite the high incarceration rate in the United
  States, our criminal justice system is not cost effective,
  disproportionately impacts minorities and the poor, and does
  not enhance public safety; and
- WHEREAS, On August 1, 2013, Senators Dick Durbin and Mike Lee introduced S. 1410, the Smarter Sentencing Act of 2013; and
- WHEREAS, The bill seeks to modernize federal drug sentencing laws by lowering mandatory minimum sentences for persons convicted of non-violent drug offenses; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The bill would apply the Fair Sentencing Act
  17 retroactively, an Act enacted in 2010 that reduced the
  18 sentencing disparity between crack and powder cocaine, by
  19 allowing the courts to review the sentences of persons
  20 convicted under the prior cocaine laws that were determined by

- 1 Congress to be unjust and racially disparate to determine
- 2 whether those persons convicted deserve sentences consistent
- 3 with current law; therefore, be it
- 4 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 5 NINETY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
- 6 we congratulate Senator Durbin for introducing the Smarter
- 7 Sentencing Act of 2013 and urge Congress to pass the bill; and
- 8 be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be
- 10 presented to the Speaker of the United States House of
- 11 Representatives, the Majority Leader of the United States
- 12 Senate, and each member of the Illinois congressional
- 13 delegation.
