2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 824 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Interagency Alternative Water Supply Policy Task Force Act.
6	Section 5. The Interagency Alternative Water Supply Policy
7	Task Force.
8	(a) There is hereby created the Interagency Alternative
9	Water Supply Policy Task Force.
10	(b) The task force shall consist of:
11	(1) the Director of the Illinois Environmental
12	Protection Agency, or his or her designee;
13	(2) the Director of Natural Resources, or his or her
14	designee;
15	(3) the Chairman of the Illinois Pollution Control
16	Board, or his or her designee;

1 (4) the Director of Agriculture, or his or her 2 designee; 3 (5) the Director of the Department of Commerce and 4 Economic Opportunity, or his or her designee; 5 (6) the Director of Public Health, or his or her 6 designee; (7) one member appointed by the Governor, representing 7 the interests of the Prairie Research Institute; 8 9 (8) one member appointed by the Governor, representing 10 the interests of the Illinois State Water Survey; 11 (9) one member appointed by the Governor, representing the interests of the Illinois State Geological Survey; and 12 13 (10)one member appointed by the Governor, 14 representing the interests of the Illinois Sustainable 15 Technology Center, who will serve as the chairperson of the 16 committee. 17 (c) The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency shall 18 provide technical support and assistance to the task force and 19 shall be responsible for administering its operations and 20 ensuring that the requirements of this Act are met. 21 (d) The task force may consult with any persons or entities 22 it deems necessary to carry out its purposes. 23 (e) Members of the task force shall be appointed no later 24 than 90 days after the effective date of this Act. The members 25 of the task force shall receive no compensation for serving as 26 members of the task force.

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1 (f) The task force shall convene at regular, scheduled intervals to study the potential use of alternative water 2 3 supplies in Illinois and to determine overarching goals for 4 alternative water supply use. The task force shall create a 5 report that reviews existing regulatory conditions and the available scientific research and institutional 6 latest 7 knowledge to evaluate and document:

8 (1) the existing opportunities for, and barriers to,
9 use of alternative water supplies;

10 recommended legislative and administrative (2) requirements for aligning individual agency policies, 11 programs, or strategies to support the goals of alternative 12 water supply use, including possible amendments to the 13 14 University of Illinois Scientific Surveys Act, the 15 Illinois Groundwater Protection Act, the Rivers, Lakes, 16 and Streams Act, and the Green Infrastructure for Clean 17 Water Act:

18 (3) any overlaps, gaps, or contradictions in 19 administrative rules with regard to water quality 20 standards or usage requirements for the alternative water 21 supplies;

(4) the water supply, water quality, and public health
implications of creating rules to regulate and promote use
of alternative water supplies;

(5) the existing and potential new regulatory or
 economic incentive programs to support alternative water

1 supply usage; and (6) the potential for a market for alternative water 2 supplies in Illinois, including economic implications, 3 4 such as job creation and increased availability of water 5 supply. The task force shall submit its report and 6 (q) 7 recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor on or before January 1, 2017. 8

9 Section 10. Expiration. This Act is repealed on January 1,10 2018.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".
