SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Election Code. Provides that the grace period for voter registration before primary and general elections shall close the day before the election (now the third day before the election).

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AN ACT concerning elections.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing 5 Sections 4-50, 5-50, and 6-100 as follows:

6 (10 ILCS 5/4-50)

7 4-50. Grace period. Notwithstanding Sec. any other 8 provision of this Code to the contrary, each election authority 9 shall establish procedures for the registration of voters and 10 for change of address during the period from the close of registration for a primary or election and until the 3rd day 11 before the primary or election. During this grace period, an 12 unregistered qualified elector may register to vote, and a 13 14 registered voter may submit a change of address form, in person in the office of the election authority or at a voter 15 16 registration location specifically designated for this purpose 17 by the election authority. The election authority shall register that individual, or change a registered voter's 18 19 address, in the same manner as otherwise provided by this Article for registration and change of address. 20

If a voter who registers or changes address during this grace period wishes to vote at the first election or primary occurring after the grace period, he or she must do so by grace period voting, either in person in the office of the election authority or at a location specifically designated for this purpose by the election authority, or by mail, at the discretion of the election authority. Grace period voting shall be in a manner substantially similar to voting under Article 19.

7 Within one day after a voter casts a grace period ballot, 8 the election authority shall transmit the voter's name, street 9 address, and precinct, ward, township, and district numbers, as 10 the case may be, to the State Board of Elections, which shall 11 maintain those names and that information in an electronic 12 format on its website, arranged by county and accessible to State and local political committees. The name of each person 13 14 issued a grace period ballot shall also be placed on the 15 appropriate precinct list of persons to whom absentee and early 16 ballots have been issued, for use as provided in Sections 17-9 17 and 18-5.

A person who casts a grace period ballot shall not be 18 permitted to revoke that ballot and vote another ballot with 19 20 respect to that primary or election. Ballots cast by persons 21 who register or change address during the grace period must be 22 transmitted to and counted at the election authority's central 23 ballot counting location and shall not be transmitted to and counted at precinct polling places. The grace period ballots 24 25 determined to be valid shall be added to the vote totals for 26 the precincts for which they were cast in the order in which

During this grace period, an 10 unregistered qualified elector may register to vote, and a 11 registered voter may submit a change of address form, in person 12 in the office of the election authority or at a voter 13 registration location specifically designated for this purpose 14 by the election authority. provision of this Code to the contrary, each election authority 1 2 shall establish procedures for the registration of voters and for change of address during the period from the close of 3 registration for a primary or election and until the 3rd day 4 5 before the primary or election. During this grace period, an 6 unregistered qualified elector may register to vote, and a 7 registered voter may submit a change of address form, in person in the office of the election authority or at a voter 8 9 registration location specifically designated for this purpose 10 by the election authority. The election authority shall register that individual, or change a registered voter's 11 12 address, in the same manner as otherwise provided by this 13 Article for registration and change of address.

If a voter who registers or changes address during this 14 15 grace period wishes to vote at the first election or primary 16 occurring after the grace period, he or she must do so by grace 17 period voting, either in person in the office of the election authority or at a location specifically designated for this 18 purpose by the election authority, or by mail, at the 19 20 discretion of the election authority.
