

98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2013 and 2014 SB1494

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 80/4.33 5 ILCS 80/4.23 rep. 225 ILCS 60/21

from Ch. 111, par. 4400-21

Amends the Regulatory Sunset Act. Extends the repeal of the Medical Practice Act of 1987 from December 31, 2013 to December 31, 2023. Amends the Medical Practice Act of 1987. Provides that a completed initial license application and a completed initial license application by endorsement that has been submitted to the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation shall be processed by the Department within 45 calendar days after receipt. Makes changes to the various fees for the renewal of a license for a resident of Illinois and nonresidents. Provides that an individual who has a 3-year temporary license and applies for an initial license shall pay the fee for a renewal of a license instead of applying for an initial license under certain provisions of the Act. Provides that the State Comptroller shall order and the State Treasurer shall transfer \$9,600,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois State Medical Disciplinary Fund. Effective immediately.

- 9 disposition and collection of fees.
- 10 (A) Renewal. The expiration date and renewal period for
- 11 each license issued under this Act shall be set by rule. The
- 12 holder of a license may renew the license by paying the
- 13 required fee. The holder of a license may also renew the
- license within 90 days after its expiration by complying with
- 15 the requirements for renewal and payment of an additional fee.
- 16 A license renewal within 90 days after expiration shall be
- 17 effective retroactively to the expiration date.
- The Department shall mail to each licensee under this Act,
- 19 at his or her address of record, at least 60 days in advance of
- 20 the expiration date of his or her license, a renewal notice. No
- 21 such license shall be deemed to have lapsed until 90 days after
- 22 the expiration date and after such notice has been mailed by
- 23 the Department as herein provided.

(B) Restoration. Any licensee who has permitted his or her license to lapse or who has had his or her license on inactive status may have his or her license restored by making application to the Department and filing proof acceptable to the Department of his or her fitness to have the license restored, including evidence certifying to active practice in another jurisdiction satisfactory to the Department, proof of meeting the continuing education requirements for one renewal period, and by paying the required restoration fee.

If the licensee has not maintained an active practice in another jurisdiction satisfactory to the Department, the Licensing Board shall determine, by an evaluation program established by rule, the applicant's fitness to resume active status and may require the licensee to complete a period of evaluated clinical experience and may require successful completion of a practical examination specified by the Licensing Board.

However, any registrant whose license has expired while he or she has been engaged (a) in Federal Service on active duty with the Army of the United States, the United States Navy, the Marine Corps, the Air Force, the Coast Guard, the Public Health Service or the State Militia called into the service or training of the United States of America, or (b) in training or education under the supervision of the United States preliminary to induction into the military service, may have his or her license reinstated or restored without paying any

- lapsed renewal fees, if within 2 years after honorable termination of such service, training, or education, he or she furnishes to the Department with satisfactory evidence to the effect that he or she has been so engaged and that his or her service, training, or education has been so terminated.
 - (C) Inactive licenses. Any licensee who notifies the Department, in writing on forms prescribed by the Department, may elect to place his or her license on an inactive status and shall, subject to rules of the Department, be excused from payment of renewal fees until he or she notifies the Department in writing of his or her desire to resume active status.

Any licensee requesting restoration from inactive status shall be required to pay the current renewal fee, provide proof of meeting the continuing education requirements for the period of time the license is inactive not to exceed one renewal period, and shall be required to restore his or her license as provided in subsection (B).

Any licensee whose license is in an inactive status shall not practice in the State of Illinois.

(D) Disposition of monies collected. All monies collected under this Act by the Department shall be deposited in the Illinois State Medical Disciplinary Fund in the State Treasury, and used only for the following purposes: (a) by the Disciplinary Board and Licensing Board in the exercise of its powers and performance of its duties, as such use is made by the Department with full consideration of all recommendations

- of the Disciplinary Board and Licensing Board, (b) for costs
- directly related to persons licensed under this Act, and (c)
- 3 for direct and allocable indirect costs related to the public
- 4 purposes of the Department.
- 5 Moneys in the Fund may be transferred to the Professions
- 6 Indirect Cost Fund as authorized under Section 2105-300 of the
- 7 Department of Professional Regulation Law (20 ILCS
- 8 2105/2105-300).
- 9 The State Comptroller shall order and the State Treasurer
- shall transfer \$9,600,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the
- 11 Illinois State Medical Disciplinary Fund as soon as practicable
- 12 after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 98th

- 14 All earnings received from investment of monies in the

- 18 (E) Fees. The following fees are nonrefundable.
- 19 (1) Applicants for any examination shall be required to
- 20 pay, either to the Department or to the designated testing
- service, a fee covering the cost of determining the
- 22 applicant's eligibility and providing the examination.
- Failure to appear for the examination on the scheduled
- 24 date, at the time and place specified, after the
- applicant's application for examination has been received
- and acknowledged by the Department or the designated

testing service, shall result in the forfeiture of the examination fee.

- (2) The fee for <u>an initial</u> a license under Section 9 of this Act is \$500 \$300. A completed application for an initial license under Section 9 of this Act that has been submitted to the Department shall be processed by the Department within 45 calendar days after receipt.
- (3) The fee for <u>an initial</u> a license under Section 19 of this Act is \$500 \$300. A completed application for an <u>initial license under Section 19 of this Act that has been</u> submitted to the Department shall be processed by the Department within 45 calendar days after receipt.
- (4) The fee for the renewal of a license for a resident of Illinois shall be calculated at the rate of \$167 \$100 per year, except for licensees who were issued a license within 12 months of the expiration date of the license, the fee for the renewal shall be \$167 \$100. The fee for the renewal of a license for a nonresident shall be calculated at the rate of \$250 \$200 per year, except for licensees who were issued a license within 12 months of the expiration date of the license, the fee for the renewal shall be \$250 \$200.
- (5) The fee for the restoration of a license other than from inactive status, is $\frac{$167}{$100}$. In addition, payment of all lapsed renewal fees not to exceed $\frac{$750}{$600}$ is required.

- (7) The fee for the issuance of a duplicate license, for the issuance of a replacement license for a license which has been lost or destroyed, or for the issuance of a license with a change of name or address other than during the renewal period is \$20. No fee is required for name and address changes on Department records when no duplicate license is issued.
- (8) The fee to be paid for a license record for any purpose is \$20.
- (9) The fee to be paid to have the scoring of an examination, administered by the Department, reviewed and verified, is \$20 plus any fees charged by the applicable testing service.
- (10) The fee to be paid by a licensee for a wall certificate showing his or her license shall be the actual cost of producing the certificate as determined by the Department.
- (11) The fee for a roster of persons licensed as physicians in this State shall be the actual cost of producing such a roster as determined by the Department.
- (F) Any person who delivers a check or other payment to the

Department that is returned to the Department unpaid by the 1 2 financial institution upon which it is drawn shall pay to the 3 Department, in addition to the amount already owed to the Department, a fine of \$50. The fines imposed by this Section 5 are in addition to any other discipline provided under this Act for unlicensed practice or practice on a nonrenewed license. 6 7 The Department shall notify the person that payment of fees and 8 fines shall be paid to the Department by certified check or 9 money order within 30 calendar days of the notification. If, 10 after the expiration of 30 days from the date of the 11 notification, the person has failed to submit the necessary 12 remittance, the Department shall automatically terminate the 13 or certificate or deny the application, without 14 hearing. If, after termination or denial, the person seeks a 15 license or certificate, he or she shall apply to the Department 16 for restoration or issuance of the license or certificate and 17 pay all fees and fines due to the Department. The Department may establish a fee for the processing of an application for 18 restoration of a license or certificate to pay all expenses of 19 20 processing this application. The Secretary may waive the fines due under this Section in individual cases where the Secretary 21 22 finds that the fines would be unreasonable or unnecessarily 23 burdensome.
