## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act is 5 amended by changing Sections 35 and 38 as follows:

Sec. 35. Monetary award program.

8 (a) The Commission shall, each year, receive and consider 9 applications for grant assistance under this Section. Subject 10 to a separate appropriation for such purposes, an applicant is 11 eligible for a grant under this Section when the Commission 12 finds that the applicant:

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(1) is a resident of this State and a citizen or permanent resident of the United States; and

(2) in the absence of grant assistance, will be
deterred by financial considerations from completing an
educational program at the qualified institution of his or
her choice.

(b) The Commission shall award renewals only upon the student's application and upon the Commission's finding that the applicant:

(1) has remained a student in good standing;(2) remains a resident of this State; and

(3) is in a financial situation that continues to 1 2 warrant assistance. 3 However, if a recipient of a grant under this Section is not permitted to continue attending an institution because he or 4 5 she is not earning the minimum grades needed to continue to attend the institution, then that person may not receive a 6 7 grant under this Section during the following academic year. 8 The Commission may adopt any rules necessary for the

9 <u>enforcement of this prohibition.</u>

10 (c) All grants shall be applicable only to tuition and 11 necessary fee costs. The Commission shall determine the grant 12 amount for each student, which shall not exceed the smallest of 13 the following amounts:

(1) subject to appropriation, \$5,468 for fiscal year
2009, \$5,968 for fiscal year 2010, and \$6,468 for fiscal
year 2011 and each fiscal year thereafter, or such lesser
amount as the Commission finds to be available, during an
academic year;

(2) the amount which equals 2 semesters or 3 quarters
tuition and other necessary fees required generally by the
institution of all full-time undergraduate students; or

(3) such amount as the Commission finds to be
appropriate in view of the applicant's financial
resources.

25 Subject to appropriation, the maximum grant amount for 26 students not subject to subdivision (1) of this subsection (c) SB1592 Engrossed - 3 - LRB098 07802 NHT 37884 b

1 must be increased by the same percentage as any increase made 2 by law to the maximum grant amount under subdivision (1) of 3 this subsection (c).

"Tuition and other necessary fees" as used in this Section 4 5 include the customary charge for instruction and use of facilities in general, and the additional fixed fees charged 6 for specified purposes, which are required generally of 7 8 nongrant recipients for each academic period for which the 9 grant applicant actually enrolls, but do not include fees 10 payable only once or breakage fees and other contingent 11 deposits which are refundable in whole or in part. The 12 Commission may prescribe, by rule not inconsistent with this 13 Section, detailed provisions concerning the computation of 14 tuition and other necessary fees.

(d) No applicant, including those presently receiving scholarship assistance under this Act, is eligible for monetary award program consideration under this Act after receiving a baccalaureate degree or the equivalent of 135 semester credit hours of award payments.

(e) The Commission, in determining the number of grants to be offered, shall take into consideration past experience with the rate of grant funds unclaimed by recipients. The Commission shall notify applicants that grant assistance is contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds.

designated by this association from among its membership, make recommendations on possible changes to how the Commission determines the number of grants to be offered and to whom they are offered.

5 (f) The Commission may request appropriations for deposit 6 into the Monetary Award Program Reserve Fund. Monies deposited 7 into the Monetary Award Program Reserve Fund may be expended 8 exclusively for one purpose: to make Monetary Award Program 9 grants to eligible students. Amounts on deposit in the Monetary 10 Award Program Reserve Fund may not exceed 2% of the current 11 annual State appropriation for the Monetary Award Program.

12 The purpose of the Monetary Award Program Reserve Fund is 13 to enable the Commission each year to assure as many students 14 as possible of their eligibility for a Monetary Award Program 15 grant and to do so before commencement of the academic year. 16 Moneys deposited in this Reserve Fund are intended to enhance 17 the Commission's management of the Monetary Award Program, necessity, magnitude, and frequency 18 minimizing the of 19 adjusting award amounts and ensuring that the annual Monetary 20 Award Program appropriation can be fully utilized.

(g) The Commission shall determine the eligibility of and make grants to applicants enrolled at qualified for-profit institutions in accordance with the criteria set forth in this Section. The eligibility of applicants enrolled at such for-profit institutions shall be limited as follows:

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(1) Beginning with the academic year 1997, only to

eligible first-time freshmen and first-time transfer
 students who have attained an associate degree.

3 (2) Beginning with the academic year 1998, only to 4 eligible freshmen students, transfer students who have 5 attained an associate degree, and students who receive a 6 grant under paragraph (1) for the academic year 1997 and 7 whose grants are being renewed for the academic year 1998.

8 (3) Beginning with the academic year 1999, to all 9 eligible students.

12 Sec. 38. Monetary award program accountability.

13 (a) The Illinois Student Assistance Commission is directed 14 to assess the educational persistence of monetary award program 15 recipients. An assessment under this Section shall include an 16 analysis of such factors as undergraduate educational goals, chosen field of study, retention rates, and expected time to 17 18 complete a degree. The assessment also shall include an 19 analysis of the academic success of monetary award program 20 recipients through a review of measures that are typically 21 associated with academic success, such as grade point average, 22 satisfactory academic progress, and credit hours earned. Each analysis should take into consideration student class level, 23 24 dependency types, and the type of higher education institution 25 at which each monetary award program recipient is enrolled. 1	Commission shall report its findings to the General Assembly
2	and the Board of Higher Education by February 1, 1999 and at
3	least every 2 years thereafter.
4	(b) To demonstrate the value of the monetary award program
5	and determine where improvements could be made, institutions
6	shall provide information concerning grant recipients to the
7	Commission if requested, including without limitation the
8	following:
9	(1) Completion and graduation rates.
10	(2) Courses attempted versus courses completed.
11	(3) The number of remedial courses undertaken, the
12	names of these courses, and the success rate of these
13	courses.
14	(4) Chosen fields of study.
15	(5) The receipt of institutional financial aid, how
16	much of that aid is merit-only aid, how much is need-based
17	aid, and how this aid dovetails with State and federal
18	financial aid.
19	The Commission may consult with the Illinois Association of
20	Student Financial Aid Administrators to develop guidelines for
21	the information to be provided under this subsection (b).
22	Each year, the Commission shall compile the information
23	provided under this subsection (b) in a report to be submitted
24	to the General Assembly and the Governor.
