

98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2013 and 2014 SB1742

Introduced 2/15/2013, by Sen. Chapin Rose

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

305 ILCS 5/12-4.4a new

Amends the Illinois Public Aid Code. Provides that the Secretary of Human Services shall seek a waiver from the United States Department of Agriculture to allow the State to specify certain foods that may and may not be purchased in Illinois with the benefits funded by the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) (formerly known as the Food Stamp Program), including a general ban on the use of SNAP benefits to purchase foods of minimal nutritional value such as carbonated soft drinks, snack cakes, candies, chewing gum, flavored ice bars, and fried, high-fat chips. Requires the Secretary to consult with members of the General Assembly in developing the waiver and to obtain approval from the General Assembly before implementing the waiver.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by adding Section 12-4.4a as follows:

- Sec. 12-4.4a. SNAP program; waiver to determine food that
- 8 <u>may be purchased in Illinois.</u>
- 9 <u>(a) As used in this Section:</u>
- "SNAP" means the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
 Program (formerly known as the Food Stamp Program).
- 12 <u>(b) The Secretary of Human Services shall seek a waiver</u>
- from the United States Department of Agriculture to allow the
- 14 State to specify foods that may and may not be purchased in
- 15 <u>Illinois with benefits funded by the federal SNAP program,</u>
- including a general ban on the use of SNAP benefits to purchase
- foods of minimal nutritional value such as carbonated soft
- drinks, snack cakes, candies, chewing gum, flavored ice bars,
- and fried, high-fat chips. The Secretary shall consult with
- 20 members of the General Assembly in developing the waiver and
- 21 must obtain the approval of the General Assembly prior to
- 22 implementing the waiver.
