SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

60 ILCS 1/30-50

Amends the Township Code. Provides the a township or township road district may lease or sell (now dispose of) personal property by a vote of the township board or request of the township highway commissioner. Deletes references to personal property valued for sale at \$2,500 or less. Provides that the township board or the highway commissioner may authorize the sale of personal property by public auction conducted by a licensed auctioneer or through an approved Internet auction service. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning local government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Township Code is amended by changing Section
30-50 as follows:

6 (60 ILCS 1/30-50)

7 Sec. 30-50. Purchase and use of property.

8 (a) The electors may make all orders for the purchase, 9 sale, conveyance, regulation, or use of the township's corporate property (including the direct sale or lease of 10 single township road district property) that may be deemed 11 conducive to the interests of its inhabitants, including the 12 lease, for up to 10 years, or for up to 25 years if the lease is 13 14 for a wireless telecommunications tower, at fair market value, of corporate property for which no use or need during the lease 15 16 period is anticipated at the time of leasing. The property may 17 be leased to another governmental body, however, or to a not-for-profit corporation that has contracted to construct or 18 19 fund the construction of a structure or improvement upon the 20 real estate owned by the township and that has contracted with 21 the township to allow the township to use at least a portion of 22 the structure or improvement to be constructed upon the real estate leased and not otherwise used by the township, for any 23

term not exceeding 50 years and for any consideration. In the 1 2 case of a not-for-profit corporation, the township shall hold a 3 public hearing on the proposed lease. The township clerk shall give notice of the hearing by publication in a newspaper 4 5 published in the township, or in a newspaper published in the 6 county and having general circulation in the township if no newspaper is published in the township, and by posting notices 7 in at least 5 public places at least 10 days before the public 8 9 hearing.

10 (b) If a new tax is to be levied or an existing tax rate is 11 to be increased above the statutory limits for the purchase of 12 the property, however, no action otherwise authorized in 13 subsection (a) shall be taken unless a petition signed by at 14 least 10% of the registered voters residing in the township is 15 presented to the township clerk. If a petition is presented to 16 the township clerk, the clerk shall order a referendum on the 17 proposition. The referendum shall be held at the next annual or special township meeting or at an election in accordance with 18 the general election law. If the referendum is ordered to be 19 20 held at the township meeting, the township clerk shall give notice that at the next annual or special township meeting the 21 22 proposition shall be voted upon. The notice shall set forth the 23 proposition and shall be given by publication in a newspaper published in the township. If there is no newspaper published 24 25 in the township, the notice shall be published in a newspaper 26 published in the county and having general circulation in the

township. Notice also shall be given by posting notices in at 1 2 least 5 public places at least 10 days before the township meeting. If the referendum is ordered to be held at an 3 election, the township clerk shall certify that proposition to 4 5 the proper election officials, who shall submit the proposition 6 The proposition shall be at. an election. submitted in 7 accordance with the general election law.

8 (c) If the leased property is utilized in part for private 9 use and in part for public use, those portions of the 10 improvements devoted to private use are fully taxable. The land 11 is exempt from taxation to the extent that the uses on the land 12 are public and taxable to the extent that the uses are private.

13 (d) Before the township makes a lease or sale of township 14 or road district real property, the electors shall adopt a 15 resolution stating the intent to lease or sell the real property, describing the property in full, and stating the 16 17 terms and conditions the electors deem necessary and desirable for the lease or sale. A resolution stating the intent to sell 18 19 property shall also contain pertinent information real 20 concerning the size, use, and zoning of the property. The value of real property shall be determined by a State licensed real 21 22 estate appraiser. The appraisal shall be available for public 23 inspection. The resolution may direct the sale to be conducted by the staff of the township or by listing with local licensed 24 25 real estate agencies (in which case the terms of the agent's 26 compensation shall be included in the resolution).

1 Anytime during the year, the township or township road 2 district may <u>lease or sell</u> dispose of personal property by a 3 vote of the township board or request of the township highway 4 commissioner.

5 The clerk shall thereafter publish the resolution or personal property sale notice once in a newspaper published in 6 7 the township or, if no newspaper is published in the township, 8 in a newspaper generally circulated in the township. If no 9 newspaper is generally circulated in the township, the clerk 10 shall post the resolution or personal property sale notice in 5 11 of the most public places in the township. In addition to the 12 foregoing publication requirements, the clerk shall post the 13 resolution or personal property sale notice at the office of the township (if township property is involved) or at the 14 office of the road district (if road district property is 15 16 involved). The following information shall be published or 17 posted with the resolution or personal property sale notice: (i) the date by which all bids must be received by the township 18 19 or road district, which shall not be less than 30 days after 20 the date of publication or posting, and (ii) the place, time, and date at which bids shall be opened, which shall be at a 21 22 regular meeting of the township board.

All bids shall be opened by the clerk (or someone duly appointed to act for the clerk) at the regular meeting of the township board described in the notice. With respect to township personal property, except personal property valued

for sale at \$2,500 or less, the township board may accept the 1 2 high bid or any other bid determined to be in the best interests of the township by a majority vote of the board. With 3 respect to township real property, the township board may 4 5 accept the high bid or any other bid determined to be in the 6 best interests of the township by a vote of three-fourths of 7 the township board then holding office, but in no event at a price less than 80% of the appraised value. With respect to 8 9 road district property, except personal property valued for 10 sale at \$2,500 or less, the highway commissioner may accept the 11 high bid or any other bid determined to be in the best 12 interests of the road district. In each case, the township 13 board or commissioner may reject any and all bids. With respect 14 to township or road district personal property valued for sale at \$2,500 or less, the clerk shall accept at least 2 bids and 15 16 the township board or highway commissioner shall accept the 17 highest bid. This notice and competitive bidding procedure shall not be followed when property is leased to another 18 19 governmental body. The notice and competitive bidding procedure shall not be followed when property is declared 20 surplus by the electors and sold to another governmental body. 21

22 <u>The township board or the highway commissioner may</u> 23 <u>authorize the sale of personal property by public auction</u> 24 <u>conducted by an auctioneer licensed under the Auction License</u> 25 <u>Act or through an approved Internet auction service.</u>

(e) A trade-in of machinery or equipment on new or
