1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. "AN ACT making appropriations", Public Act
6 98-0034, approved June 27, 2013, is amended by changing
7 Section 5 of Article 1 as follows:

8 (P.A. 98-0034, Art. 1, Sec. 5)

9 Sec. 5. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be
10 necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State Board of
11 Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and not,
12 under any circumstances, for personal services expenditures
13 or other operational or administrative costs, are
14 appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for the
15 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013:
