# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

### ARTICLE 0.5

Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a 5 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations 6 7 made in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the 8 School Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the 9 Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond 10 Series B Fund, the Coal Development Fund, the Transportation 11 Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be 12 paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds 13 subsequently issued by the State.

The sum of \$314,597, or so much thereof as 4 5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of 6 business on June 30, 2014, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 48, Section 5 of Public Act 7 8 98-0050, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build 9 Illinois Bond Fund for the Illinois Community College Board remodeling of facilities for compliance with the 10 for 11 Americans with Disabilities Act. This appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other appropriated amounts which 12 13 can be expended for these purposes.

14 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or 15 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations 16 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and 17 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.
