WHEREAS, Quigley Fletcher was born in Akron, Iowa on January 19, 1933 to Quigley and Fannie (nee Cooper) Fletcher; he lived for a time in Iowa, New Jersey, Oklahoma, Nebraska and Illinois; he attended Palatine High School for 2 years and graduated from Robling High School in New Jersey in 1950; he joined the National Guard and served with the United States Army during the Korean War; he was discharged in 1952; he married Diane in 1955 in Des Plaines and they resided in the same home for 57 years; and

WHEREAS, Following his discharge, Quigley Fletcher attended night school at the Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago, where he received a degree in Civil Engineering; he was also a licensed Professional Engineer for the states of Illinois and Wisconsin; in 1952, he began working for Kimball Hill and Associates; he then worked for Fletcher Engineering, Harza Engineering, and Plote, Inc.; he retired from Plote, Inc. in 1989 and continued in the business with Glander Paving, Dipaolo Company, and Petro Paving; he fully retired in 2008 so he could relax and be at home with his wife, Diane; and
