#### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

25 ILCS 115/1 from Ch. 63, par. 14  
25 ILCS 115/1.10 new  
25 ILCS 120/6.3 new

Amends the General Assembly Compensation Act. Establishes the fiscal year 2016 mileage reimbursement rate and allowance for lodging and meals. Requires every member of the 99th General Assembly to forfeit one day of compensation during each month of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015. Amends the Compensation Review Act. Prohibits a fiscal year 2016 cost-of-living adjustment for State government legislative and executive elected officers and appointees in positions for which the Compensation Review Board previously recommended or determined compensation. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning State government.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**  
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The General Assembly Compensation Act is amended  
5 by changing Section 1 and by adding Section 1.10 as follows:

6 (25 ILCS 115/1) (from Ch. 63, par. 14)

7 Sec. 1. Each member of the General Assembly shall receive  
8 an annual salary of \$28,000 or as set by the Compensation  
9 Review Board, whichever is greater. The following named  
10 officers, committee chairmen and committee minority spokesmen  
11 shall receive additional amounts per year for their services as  
12 such officers, committee chairmen and committee minority  
13 spokesmen respectively, as set by the Compensation Review Board  
14 or, as follows, whichever is greater: Beginning the second  
15 Wednesday in January 1989, the Speaker and the minority leader  
16 of the House of Representatives and the President and the  
17 minority leader of the Senate, \$16,000 each; the majority  
18 leader in the House of Representatives \$13,500; 6 assistant  
19 majority leaders and 5 assistant minority leaders in the  
20 Senate, \$12,000 each; 6 assistant majority leaders and 6  
21 assistant minority leaders in the House of Representatives,  
22 \$10,500 each; 2 Deputy Majority leaders in the House of  
23 Representatives \$11,500 each; and 2 Deputy Minority leaders in

1 the House of Representatives, \$11,500 each; the majority caucus  
2 chairman and minority caucus chairman in the Senate, \$12,000  
3 each; and beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the  
4 majority conference chairman and the minority conference  
5 chairman in the House of Representatives, \$10,500 each;  
6 beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the chairman  
7 and minority spokesman of each standing committee of the  
8 Senate, except the Rules Committee, the Committee on  
9 Committees, and the Committee on Assignment of Bills, \$6,000  
10 each; and beginning the second Wednesday in January, 1989, the  
11 chairman and minority spokesman of each standing and select  
12 committee of the House of Representatives, \$6,000 each. A  
13 member who serves in more than one position as an officer,  
14 committee chairman, or committee minority spokesman shall  
15 receive only one additional amount based on the position paying  
16 the highest additional amount. The compensation provided for in  
17 this Section to be paid per year to members of the General  
18 Assembly, including the additional sums payable per year to  
19 officers of the General Assembly shall be paid in 12 equal  
20 monthly installments. The first such installment is payable on  
21 January 31, 1977. All subsequent equal monthly installments are  
22 payable on the last working day of the month. A member who has  
23 held office any part of a month is entitled to compensation for  
24 an entire month.

25 Mileage shall be paid at the rate of 20 cents per mile  
26 before January 9, 1985, and at the mileage allowance rate in

1 effect under regulations promulgated pursuant to 5 U.S.C.  
2 5707(b)(2) beginning January 9, 1985, for the number of actual  
3 highway miles necessarily and conveniently traveled by the most  
4 feasible route to be present upon convening of the sessions of  
5 the General Assembly by such member in each and every trip  
6 during each session in going to and returning from the seat of  
7 government, to be computed by the Comptroller. A member  
8 traveling by public transportation for such purposes, however,  
9 shall be paid his actual cost of that transportation instead of  
10 on the mileage rate if his cost of public transportation  
11 exceeds the amount to which he would be entitled on a mileage  
12 basis. No member may be paid, whether on a mileage basis or for  
13 actual costs of public transportation, for more than one such  
14 trip for each week the General Assembly is actually in session.  
15 Each member shall also receive an allowance of \$36 per day for  
16 lodging and meals while in attendance at sessions of the  
17 General Assembly before January 9, 1985; beginning January 9,  
18 1985, such food and lodging allowance shall be equal to the  
19 amount per day permitted to be deducted for such expenses under  
20 the Internal Revenue Code; however, beginning May 31, 1995, no  
21 allowance for food and lodging while in attendance at sessions  
22 is authorized for periods of time after the last day in May of  
23 each calendar year, except (i) if the General Assembly is  
24 convened in special session by either the Governor or the  
25 presiding officers of both houses, as provided by subsection  
26 (b) of Section 5 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution or

1 (ii) if the General Assembly is convened to consider bills  
2 vetoed, item vetoed, reduced, or returned with specific  
3 recommendations for change by the Governor as provided in  
4 Section 9 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution. For  
5 fiscal year 2011 and for session days in fiscal years 2012,  
6 2013, 2014, ~~and 2015,~~ and 2016 only (i) the allowance for  
7 lodging and meals is \$111 per day and (ii) mileage for  
8 automobile travel shall be reimbursed at a rate of \$0.39 per  
9 mile.

10 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,  
11 beginning in fiscal year 2012, travel reimbursement for General  
12 Assembly members on non-session days shall be calculated using  
13 the guidelines set forth by the Legislative Travel Control  
14 Board, except that fiscal year 2012, 2013, 2014, ~~and 2015,~~ and  
15 2016 mileage reimbursement is set at a rate of \$0.39 per mile.

16 If a member dies having received only a portion of the  
17 amount payable as compensation, the unpaid balance shall be  
18 paid to the surviving spouse of such member, or, if there be  
19 none, to the estate of such member.

22 (25 ILCS 115/1.10 new)

23 Sec. 1.10. FY16 furlough days. During each month of the  
24 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, every member of the 99th  
25 General Assembly is mandatorily required to forfeit one day of

1 compensation. The State Comptroller shall deduct the  
2 equivalent of 1/261st of the annual salary of each member of  
3 the 99th General Assembly from the compensation of that member  
4 in each month of the fiscal year. For purposes of this Section,  
5 annual compensation includes compensation paid to each member  
6 by the State for one year of service pursuant to Section 1,  
7 except any payments made for mileage and allowances for travel  
8 and meals. The forfeiture required by this Section is not  
9 considered a change in salary and shall not impact pension or  
10 other benefits provided to members of the General Assembly.

11 Section 10. The Compensation Review Act is amended by  
12 adding Section 6.3 as follows:

13 (25 ILCS 120/6.3 new)

14 Sec. 6.3. FY16 COLAs prohibited. Notwithstanding any  
15 former or current provision of this Act, any other law, any  
16 report of the Compensation Review Board, or any resolution of  
17 the General Assembly to the contrary, members of the General  
18 Assembly, State's attorneys, other than the county supplement,  
19 elected executive branch constitutional officers of State  
20 government, and persons in certain appointed offices of State  
21 government, including the membership of State departments,  
22 agencies, boards, and commissions, whose annual compensation  
23 previously was recommended or determined by the Compensation  
24 Review Board, are prohibited from receiving and shall not

1 receive any increase in compensation that would otherwise apply  
2 based on a cost of living adjustment, as authorized by Senate  
3 Joint Resolution 192 of the 86th General Assembly, for or  
4 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015.

5 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon  
6 becoming law.
