2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 3674 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Wildlife Code is amended by changing
5	Section 2.5 and by adding Section 2.5a as follows:
6	(520 ILCS 5/2.5)
7	Sec. 2.5. Crossbow conditions. A person may use a crossbow
8	if one or more of the following conditions are met:
9	(1) the user is a person age 62 and older;
10	(2) the user is a handicapped person to whom the
11	Director has issued a permit to use a crossbow, as provided
12	by administrative rule; or
13	(3) the date of using the crossbow is during the period
14	of the second Monday following the Thanksgiving holiday
15	through the last day of the archery deer hunting seasor

1 (4) the user is a person with a youth hunting license
2 who is physically unable to pull the draw weight of a bow
3 and arrow other than a crossbow.

As used in this Section, "handicapped person" means a person who has a physical impairment due to injury or disease, congenital or acquired, which renders the person them so severely disabled as to be unable to use a longbow, recurve bow, or compound bow. Permits must be issued only after the receipt of a physician's statement confirming the applicant is handicapped as defined above.

- Sec. 2.5a. Youth crossbow use. An individual with a youth
 hunting license who is physically unable to pull the draw
 weight of a bow and arrow other than a crossbow may use a
 crossbow during the regular deer archery season annually
 determined by the Director, provided that the individual
 remains under the direct supervision of an adult of 21 years of
 age or older who possesses a valid archery deer permit.
 - Youths authorized to take deer with a crossbow as provided in this Section shall first obtain a "Deer Hunting Permit" issued by the Department in accordance with its administrative rules and with the express permission of an adult of 21 years of age or older.
