Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

5	Section 1. The following named sums, or so much thereof as
6	may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
7	hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the ordinary and
8	contingent expenses of the Department of Labor:

- 2 Section 5. "Operational expenses" defined. For the
- 3 purposes of this Act, the term "operational expenses"
- 4 includes the following items:
- 5 (a) Personal Services;
- 6 (b) State contributions to Social Security
- 7 (c) Group Insurances;
- 8 (d) Contractual Services
- 9 (e) Travel;
- 10 (f) Commodities;
- 11 (g) Printing;
- 12 (h) Equipment;
- 13 (i) Electronic data processing;
- 14 (i) Telecommunications services;
- 15 (k) Operation of automotive equipment;
- 16 (l) Refunds;
- 17 (m) Employee retirement contributions paid by the employer;
- 18 (n) Permanent improvements;
- 19 (o) Deposits to other funds.
- Section 10. The amount of \$246,800, or so much thereof
- 21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Amusement Ride
- 22 and Patron Safety Fund to the Department of Labor for
- 23 operational expenses associated with the administration of
- 24 The Amusement Ride and Attraction Safety Act.

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Section 15. The amount of \$623,100, or so much thereof 1 2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Child Labor 3 Enforcement and Day and Temporary Labor Services Enforcement Fund to the Department of Labor for operational expenses 4 5 associated with the administration of The Child Labor Law Act

and the Day and Temporary Labor Services Act.

- 7 Section 20. The amount of \$348,300, or so much thereof 8 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Employee 9 Classification the Department Fund to of Labor 10 operational expenses associated with the administration of 11 The Employee Classification Act.
- 12 Section 25. The amount of \$206,200, or so much thereof 13 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wage Theft 14 Enforcement Fund to the Department of Labor for operational 15 expenses associated with the administration of The Illinois 16 Wage Payment and Collection Act.
- 17 Section 30. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof 18 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Department of 19 Labor Federal Trust Fund to the Department of Labor for all 20 associated with promoting and enforcing occupational safety and health administration state program 21

- 1 for public sector worksites.
- 2 Section 35. The amount of \$2,970,000, or so much thereof
- 3 as necessary, is appropriated from the Federal Industrial
- 4 Services Fund to the Department of Labor for administrative
- 5 and other expenses, for the Occupational Safety and Health
- 6 Administration Program, including refunds and prior year
- 7 costs.
- 8 Section 40. The amount of \$30,000, or so much thereof as
- 9 necessary, is appropriated from the Federal Industrial
- 10 Services Fund to the Department of Labor for contractual
- 11 service expenses, for the Occupational Safety and Health
- 12 Administration Program.
- 13 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
- 14 1, 2016, if and only if Senate Bill 2789 of the 99th General
- 15 Assembly (the Unbalanced Budget Response Act), as introduced
- in the Illinois Senate, becomes law.
